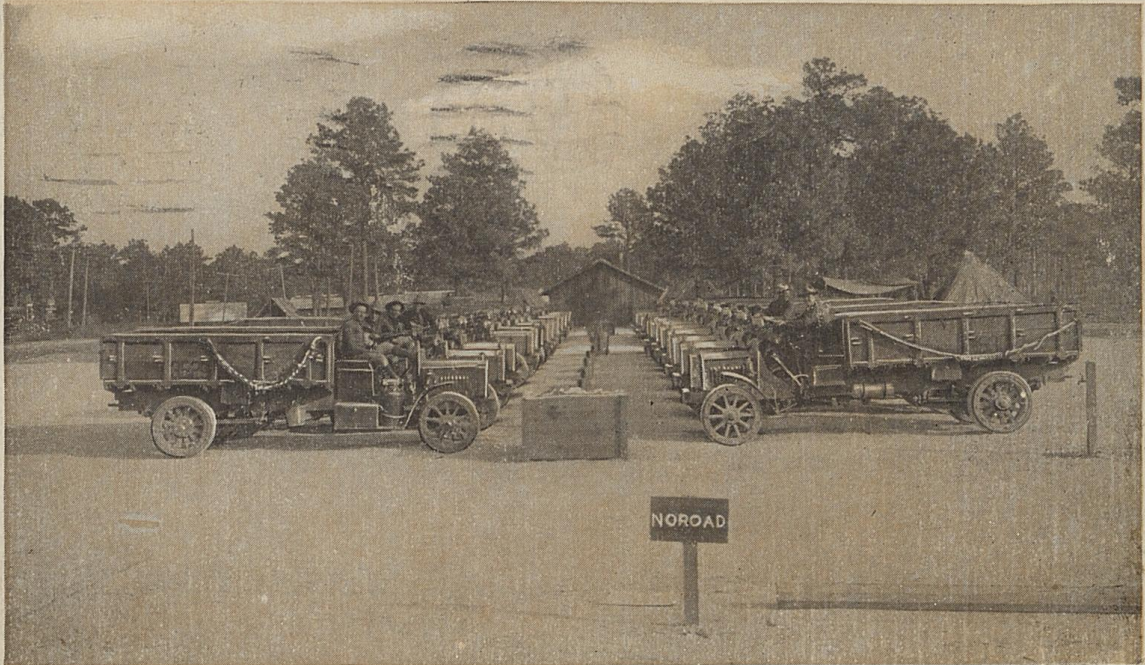

This is one of those beautiful evenings which we have been having for about a week with mud that decorates your shoes and the greater part of the leggings and nothing but rain and more mud in sight of course we can't have things our way. Do you remember the snow we had last year in the beginning of December? I sure do for one of my friends from home came to see me, he did manage to come out to camp on Saturday but had to take a machine, as you know the cars did not run for several days and in the evening he had to walk to town and on Sunday a friend of mine

and myself to go to
town to see him but
it was too much of a
good thing to walk it
in all the snow and
what is more he had
something better than
water for us at his
room and under the
regulations we were last
year I would have gone
quite a ways for it.

We had a few flakes
of snow in the latter part
of November also a few
frosts but have not
had a frost in December.

Don't know much of
interest as I have only
been away from here
once since landing here
and that was to one of
the small towns close
to here in fact there
is not much to be seen
going to these small
places as they are
charging too much for
most of the souvenirs

to my company and

go into Germany as I
noticed in the paper
they are to go to Luxemburg
I am in doubt if I will
get back or not although
I am having all of my
mail sent to the company
as I may leave here most
any day but where it
remains in darkness to
me.

Have sent to the central
P.O. for my mail and
by the time it gets here

the chances are I will
be somewhere else and
it will be another 2
months before I hear
from home or friends,
I have not had any mail
since I was wounded.


You know a soldier is
satisfied most any place
if he gets 3 squares a
place to sleep and some
smoke, not necessarily
taylor made either, while
up the line. This last
time I would have smoked
corn silks but could
not find any, have seen
fellows refuse a dollar
for a little package
of bulldurham so you can
imagine how scarce
it was and cheap, it was
out of the question in fact
I have not seen any since
last summer.
