### Traffic Tolled

Kentucky's accident toll for the first six months of 1946 far eclipsed the peak traffic year of 1941, according to the report of Colonel John Baker, director of the Kentucky highway particular to J. Stephen Watkins, commissioner, Kentucky department of highways. While deaths during the first half of 1946 numbered 340 against 361 in 1941, accidents causing injuries and amages in 1946 totaled 2722 as compared with 1389 in 1941.

"While most accidents are reported to patrol eadquarters, a great many are not recorded." Colonel Baker's report stated. "It is evident that many people do not understand the law in connection with accident reports. Failure to report motor vehicle accidents involving all admage of more than \$50 or a fatality carries a fine of from \$10 to \$100 and revocation of open ator's license.
