## Elian saga resumes as protesters fight



Demonstrators stand outside the front of the home of the Miami relatives of Elian Gonzalez where he is staying in the Little Havena area of Miami. Demonstrators streamed into the neighborhood of Elian Gonzalez's greatuncle Thursday night, linking arms in a quiet, symbolic human chain to show the government they won't permit the child to be taken.

The government "will do what is necessary" to reunite Elian Gonzalez with his father soon, a top Justice Official said Sunday, as lawyers for the boy's Miami relatives warned that the famuze of the control of the con

Outside Washington, such a vigil became noisy and tense Sunday in the Bethesda, Md., neighborhood where Elian's father, Juan Miguel Gonzalez, is staying at the home of a Cuban diplomat.

Police held the crowd back.

Justice officials, family lawyers and politicians from Washington and Havana filled the Sunday talk shows, demonstrating the preoccupation of two nations with a 6-year-old boy rescued at sea four months ago but left adrift in a wrenching international and family struggle.

In Washington, Juan Miguel Gonzalez personally thanked the two Florida fishernen who pulled the boy from the waters off Fort Laud-

erdale on Thanksgiving Day after his mother, fleeing Cuba, drowned.
Cousins Donato Dalrymple, who thinks the boy should stay in the United States, and Sam Clancio, who thinks Elian should go back to his father, emerged from their visit believing a bond exists between father and son.

After watching his team scrimmage for more than three hours Saturday after-noon in Lambeau Field-like conditions, head coach Hal Mumme still hasn't decid-ed who will be his starting quarterback next year.

Bonner led the offense to 10 touch-downs and a field goal in 18 possessions. He completed 44 of 64 passes (68 percent) for 561 yards, four touchdowns and two interceptions. Bonner also ran six times for 68 yards and three touchdowns.
Lorenzen got off to a rough start completing only three of his first 14 passes. He

also dropped the first snap of the scrimmage and his first pass, to sophomore full-back Artose Pluner in the flat, was almost intercepted.

On his second series he turned the wrong way handing off to Pinner. He was then sacked by senior Matt Layow.

He finished 17 of 43 (49 percent) for 188 yards, no touchdowns and one interception in his 13 possessions. He led the offense to one touchdown and a field goal.

Although Bonner definitely has the better numbers, Lorenzen finished strong enough to make Mumme examine the film.

"They both did, I think Dusty probably more," Mumme said. "His experience is so valuable to him right now," Mumme said.
