"I think we proved that you can win with a positive campaign." Chaney said. "Now we just look forward to completing all of our promises, and we want the students' support in doing that."


All of the candidates were pleased with voter turnout, though most agreed it could have been better. A total of 2,530 student's voted, including 2,456 who voted in the presidential race.

The election did run into some trouble with the confusion at Lexington Community College. The phone at the LCC poll was out of service for sometime, but poll workers allowed students to vote without calling in to confirm they were full-time students. Matt Thomas, chairman for the Election Board of Claims, said that the 51 people who voted at LCC without being called in made up 22 percent of the total LCC votes. To solve the

problem, the Election Board subtracted 22 percent from each senator at large's LCC total. When this new LCC total was added to the Lexington campus total, there was no difference in the order of the results in the Senate races. The totals made no difference in the presidential race either. Weitzman and Abernathy had the highest vote total at LCC, so subtracting the 22 percent would have made them lose by a larger margin.
