Isaac asks UK to pay for police

Bills: Isaac says UK can pay, Athletics say ticket price increase not intended to cover police overtime

The University of Kentucky may soon be paying for police at university basketball and football events.

Mayor Teresa Isaac recently stated that a bill would be sent to charge the university for the use of off-duty police officers who provide security and traffic control at major UK athletic events.

Currently the university or Kencky and the control of the con

overtime rate is \$32.00 per hour. Though the price has gone up, the city will only charge a total of approximately \$127,000. The bill includes a charge of \$80,822 for football games and \$38,073 for basketball games.

Director of Public Relations Mary Margaret Colliver stated the UK administration's official position.

We understand the city is having budget issues as well as the university. Colliver said. We are in the process of trying to work with the city as well as other law enforcement agencies in order to develop a plan for security and traffic control."

Isaac said she feels that with the city undergoing budget deficits, UK should shoulder some of the respon-sibility for the financial bur-den

sibility for the manner.

UK recently raised ticket prices for basketball and football games by \$5 and \$7 respectively, although ticket prices for some sections at Commonwealth Stadium will remain unchanged.

Supercomputing project sets new record

Performance and invention: Supercomputer cost efficient, uses technology created by UK research

Room 672 in Anderson Hall is not much bigger than a few closets, giving the feel of a standard 25-student high school classroom. But this humble room houses the world's cheapest terraflop su-percomputer.

On Wednesday, July 16,
electrical and computer egi-neering students, faculty and
even some high school stu-dents volunteered their time and worked in assembly-time fashion to construct the Ken-tucky ASYmmetric Zero, or

Clustered supercomput-ing is nothing new to UK. In April 2000, Dietz and volun-teers constructed KLAT2, the Kentucky Linux Athlon Test-bed. In comparison, KLAT2 had a speed of 180 GFLOPS. KASV0 is a second kentucky Linux Athlon Test-bed. In comparison, KLAT2 had a speed of 180 GFLOPS. KASY0 is a record for fi-nancially optimal supercom-puting.

"We're absolutely certain it blows away any world record," Dietz said. He also said that KASYO will have the performance of \$100 per GFLOP, whereas the KLAT2 carried a GFLOP of perfor-mance for around every \$640 spent. This sets a new record

for price and performance.
Dietz also pointed to a cluster network built out of 70 Playstation 2s at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign that doesn't get back also go for the buck like "The best they can quote is 70 Playstation 2's with an incredible \$50,000." Dietz said. "Ours is \$40,000 with 28 machines."
Dietz also said that the Playstation 2 cluster does not have the same type of processing environment that the KASY0 does.

However, when the council rejected a waiver of a 7.7 percent pay increase to their own pockets, they also waived their right to seek budget deficit assistance from other sources. Meanwhile, vital city employees received only a 1.5 percent raise.

That said, UK football and basketball games bring thousands of tourists into Lexington from all over the state and region. Isaac should be concerned

with the fact that providing protection for the games

with the fact that providing protection for the games is a necessity for the city. Footing UK with a large portion of the bill alienates the university. It says that UK is on its own for protecting its venues, but the millions of tourist doilars that come into the city are still going to be scooped up by Lexington in earnest. UK is an industry to Lexington. It creates a multi-faceted educational and cultural element within the city. The city employs thousands of students and the university itself is comparable to a corporation. UK is a vital part of the cityscape. It's worth applauding both sides for maintaining a cordial manner in discussing this issue, because in times of economic difficulties, being businesslike is all that's left between a concern and a crisis. While we understand the value and importance of the police officers that provide security at the games, they are not a luxury but a necessity. The university shouldn't be punished for budget troubles, especially when council members are

granting themselves raises.

Yes, there are things wrong. When Mike Williams and Lance Carter are all-stars in a vear in whi

Williams and Lance Carterich they combine for 11 blown saves and a 5.64 ERA and the Mike Mussinas of the world aren't, there is something wrong. But, as the saying goes, "You can't please all of the people all of the time." There could be 75-man rosters for each all-star team, and there would be a faction that complains that Kyle Lohse deserves to make the team over Jake Westbrook. There will never be a perfect way to pick an all-star team, and there shouldn't be. Baseball, like all sports, thrives in debate. Discussion of the game is just as important as the game itself.

Baseball has bigger problems. QuesTec, that demonic contraption that may soon end baseball's greatest asset, human involvement, is one of them. Pete Rose is another.

QuesTec is a new grading system for um-

pires. Cameras located throughout stadiums track pitches and determine whether a pitch is a ball or a strike. Umpires that differ from the QuesTer cading too often can be punished. He was beaball's cardinal stay that way. These problems are not so much problems with the game as they are problems about the game. These are problems that need addressing because they tarrilish the game, not because it makes owne fans upset.

I'm sure the ven New Tork Mets fans this year would have rather seen an excellent pitcher like Octavio Dotel or Hideo Nome in the All-Star Game than the Mets' representative, Armando Benilez. But who wants perfect? We as humans are not perfect, why should our creations be?
