The names of degrees listed above give only a general idea of the educational opportunities available at the University. Within the various colleges there are many possibilities for specialization and the pursuit of particular interests. These may be outlined as follows:

College of Arts and Sciences. Within this college it is possible to major in any one of twenty-eight departments as follows: Anatomy and Physiology, Ancient Languages and Literatures, Anthropology, Art, Bacteriology, Botany, Chemistry, Economics, English Language and Literature, Geography, Geology, German Language and Literature, History, Hygiene and Public Health, Journalism, Library Science, Mathematics and Astronomy, Music, Philosophy, Physical Education, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, Radio Arts, Romance Languages and Literatures, Social Work, Sociology, and Zoology.

College of Agriculture and Home Economics. Students in agriculture have twelve options: agricultural education; agricultural entomology; agricultural extension; agronomy; animal husbandry; dairying; farm economics and rural sociology; general agriculture; horticulture; markets and rural finance; poultry; and science applied to agriculture. There is also a short non-degree program in practical agriculture. Students in home economics have six options: child development and family living; clothing, textiles, and related art; general home economics; home economics education; home economics extension; institutional economics and dietetics.
