"Any time you're looking at a loss in (TV) revenue, you have to weigh that loss against whatever benefits you might receive. Crum said he wasn't advocating a State of the series.

A grand total of 25 students showed up for a Student Government Association committee program on the effects of drinking and driving Wednesday night.

There were about 40 people in the room, but only about half looked like UR students — and many of those were SGA members.

Linda Blevins lost her youngest sister, Fran, and her 12-year-old

nephew, Chad, to a drunk. Her story may have made a difference to anyone who still drives drunk under the questionable logic that he won't get caught.

Blevins told us of her drive home from a family get-together in May 1868.

"I saw headilights and I remember thinking, 'My God he's in our lane: Then he hit us.
"The car was thrown 35 feet off the road When it finally stopped, I instende for someone to breath, but no one did."

After telling us about what she saw when she opened the door and the interior light came on, Blevins had to stop to compose herself.
"Pernic's husband, Garn, was fol."

"Fran's husband, Gary, was fol-owing us in his car. I tried to keep im away from my car, but I drinking. No one is telling you to stop drinking. No one is telling you that

couldn't. I'll never forget Gary's screams when he got to them."
Blevins' other nephew, 7-year-old Michael, was in the car with Gary. The two witnessed the accident which destroyed their family.

"The morning after the accident, I had to tell Michael that his mother and his brother were dead. The only comforting thing I could think to tell him was that they were in heaven. That's not very comforting to a child who has lost more than half of his life."

Would Blevins's story have made any of you stop and think more than the possibility of a DUI con-viction does? I don't know, because you weren't there.

But it is not enough to make a mantra of this slogan. It has to mean something to you. You need to hear about Blevins seeing her sister's blood on the car's dash-board.

Whalen's death affected almost everyone on this campus — either directly or indirectly, yet the SGA people told me that the turnout for their Alcohol Awareness Week Programs has not only been low, but just as low as usual.


