Dear Bro: I spent
a week at Old Salem preaching
twice a day. The schools were in
session & the weather was unpropitious
yet we had a good meeting, though
no conversions. There are however
3 young people who will unite
with the Church if we have
preaching. I got them to agree
to pay the expenses of a student
to open a class in 5⁰⁰ per
month. so if the Committee
will grant 5⁰⁰ in addition
we can give them preaching
There are now 40 members
but I own frank to say that

they are very poor material.

The Cooney Fork Church 17 miles
away which belongs to the Northern
Church has 35 members and
I think they can do more than
the old Solent people. They
are somewhat divided, their
church is almost new. If
Uncle Joe could visit this
fall in the Spring or Summer
I think they would come to us
& greatly help us in supporting
the work at Old Solent

At present the Committee need
only allow 5⁰⁰ per mo for Solent
& 5⁰⁰ for Trenton. I would like
to hear from you soon so I may know
what to do - A little money
before Christmas would be very
acceptable to me, but don't
let it trouble you

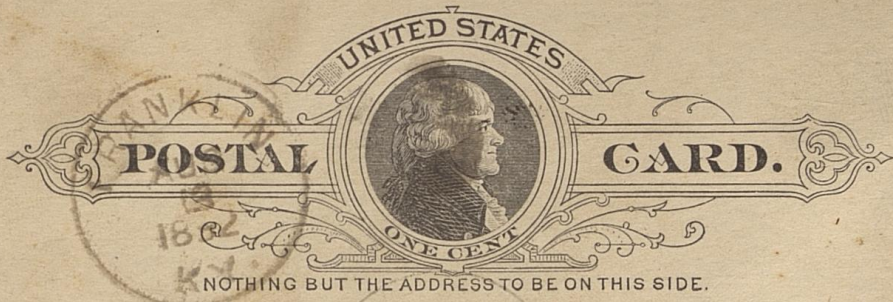

Helm.

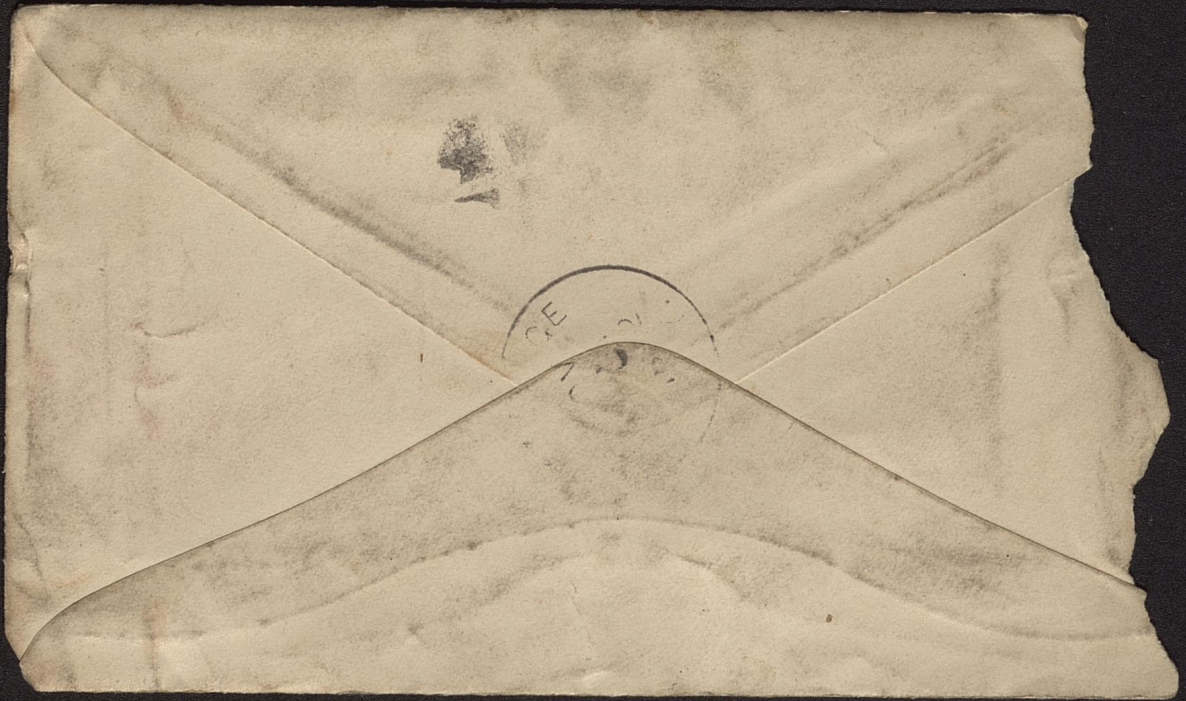

can do.

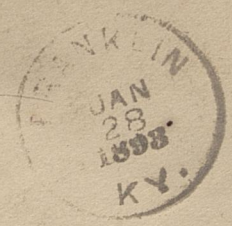
