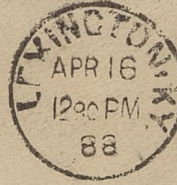

Dear Brother:

As I have not learned how your committee organized, I take it for granted you are still the Chairman, and therefore write you as such.

A few weeks ago Mr. Ben Bigstaff was in Lexington and made a suggestion which you might find to be useful. He thinks he might be of service to your committee at some destitute point by keeping up a Sabbath School and prayer-meeting and otherwise quietly working till the work justified the placing of a regular minister in charge of it. He mentioned Morehead as a place where he thought he might do some good in this way, but he would be willing to go anywhere he might be needed. All that he would ask from the committee would be to defray his travelling expenses or an allowance that would certainly cover them. He is now in control of milling and farming interests at the Forks of Elkhorn, but his duties are such that he could leave on Saturdays and be gone over Sunday to the mission work if it is given him. He speaks of this

to Mr. Cooper and myself and left it entirely with us to mention it to you or not as we thought best. I am inclined to think Mr. Cooper does not approve the suggestion on the ground that there is work enough for him to do in Frankfort and its vicinity. I have taken a different view of ^{the} matter and thought that I ought at least to write you about it.

In a ride I took with you in the summer before my meeting, I expressed to you a strong objection to having Mr. Hopper accompany Mr. Evans to my church. I wish now, in justice to Mr. Hopper and in the interest of the Evangelistic work, to say that I was totally mistaken in my estimate of Brother Hopper. Without any disparagement ~~to~~ ^{of} Mr. Evans, I would say that I would not have dispensed with Mr. Hopper for any consideration. I suppose you want all the information possible about the work these brethren are doing and this is my testimony. In my meeting he was invaluable.

I hope you may continue to direct the work and receive as great blessing in the future as you have done.

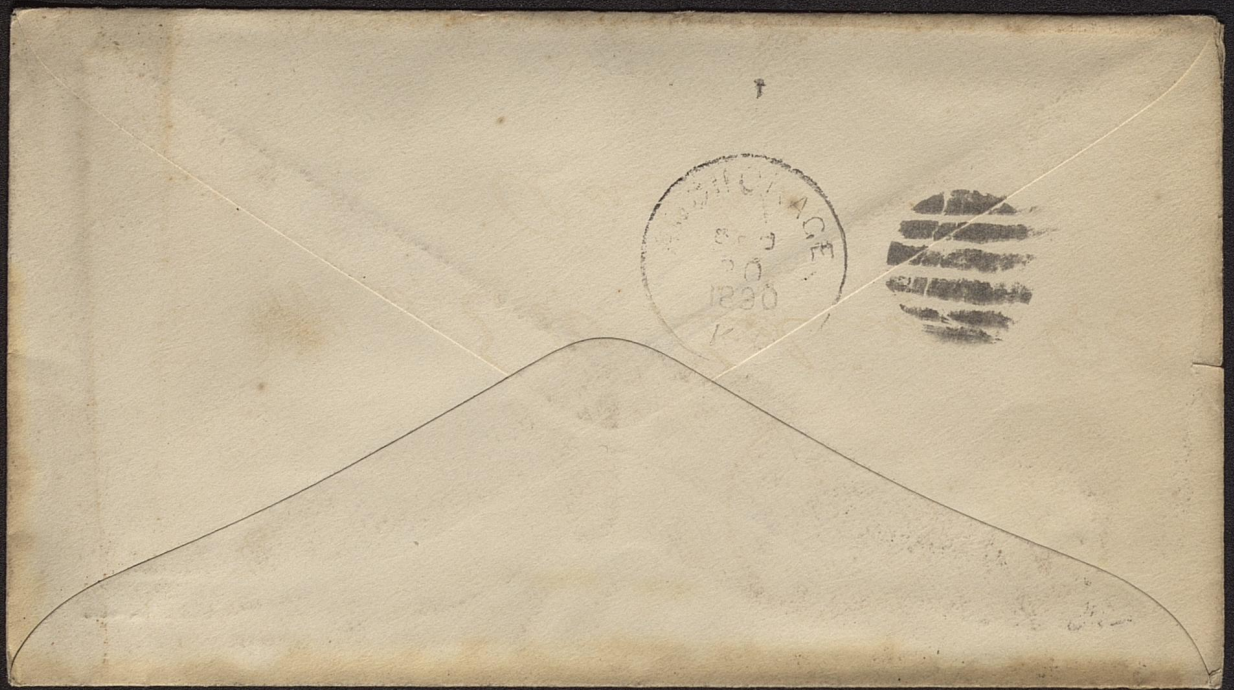

I hope your Committee will view the matter favorably.

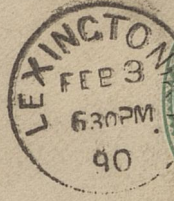

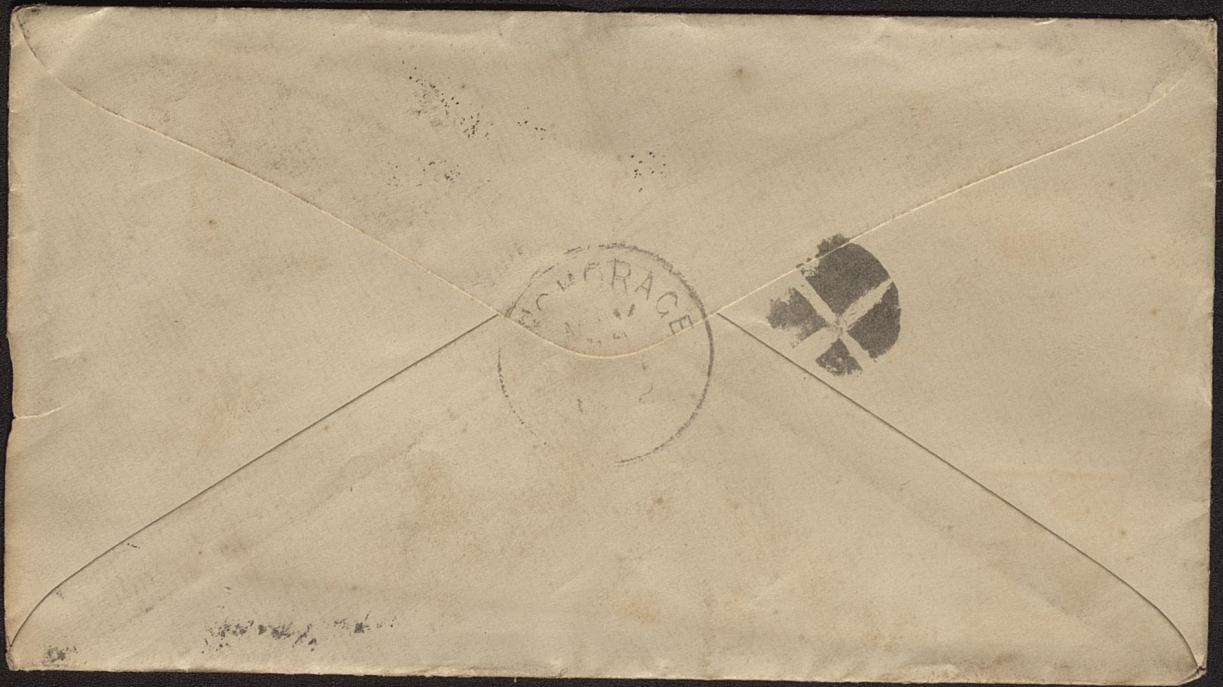
