are always on the look out

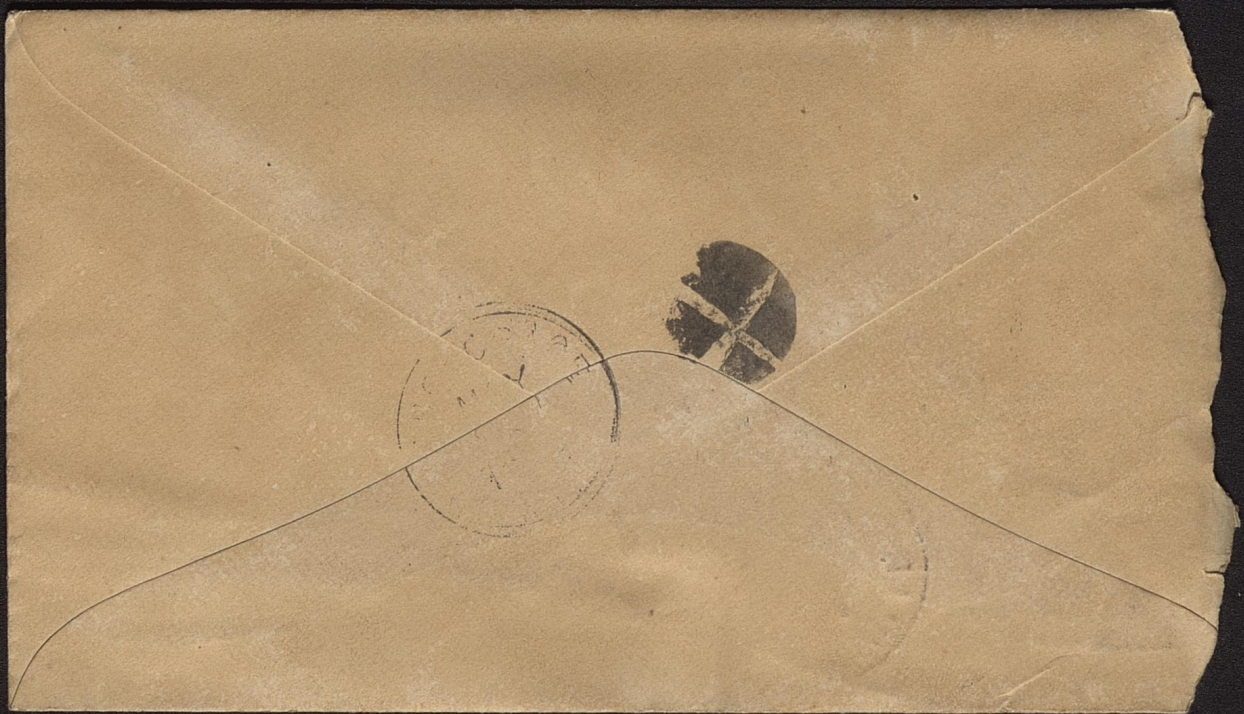
for supplies for vacant

I hope this is only a beginning — It will take self-denial & earnest effort to carry this movement out but I believe the church can make it, tho' the times are very hard. As the moderator of the meeting spoke

Your circular

+ note of appeal is to hand.

I will present the matter to
the session but I will say
now that I do not think they
will think it fit even to
attempt to do anything for
the cause you represent
now — + if they did I do
not think the congregation
would respond —

I suppose that neither
you nor the Committee
have any conception at
all of the situation of mat-
ters in the 3^d Church or
these repeated demands

would not be made, how-
ever, you cannot be in
ignorance of these things.
You know that the congrega-
tion was cut off from as-
sistance to amount of
\$300.00 last fall (& that
at the end of Nov. if I re-
member aright; 1 1/2 months
after the beginning of the
year leaving no oppor-
tunity for provision for
raising deficit for that
time) — That being the
case this congregation
ought never have been
assessed \$300.00 in the first
instance — I protested
you remember against
an additional apporportion-
ment at the Pres. at Eliza-
beth town — You said then
privately that this church

ought not to be expected to meet even all its [#]30,000 apportionment. Yet here comes this second or third appeal to raise all of the \$37,500 + before 9-30. Now the amount could be raised by taking it out of the pastor's already reduced salary. If the congregation is making special effort to raise all it can to keep from having to ask \$30,000 from Evangelization funds for supplementing its pastor's salary + its pastor is denying himself + family so as to be able to receive from 2 to 4 hundred less than the promised [#]1000 salary. I do not see how

either the session or pastor
can be expected to make
special additional self-
denials & efforts to ^{help} other
churches in the synod ~~of~~ ^{of the}
of whom are much more
able to support themselves
entirely than ~~is~~ this church.
Now, dear brother, do not
think I am not in sym-
pathy with the cause - I am
heartily with you in heart.
I write this to you because
I want to be understood
about this matter, & while
you seem, whenever you
meet me personally, to under-
stand the situation yet the
circulars &c in your name
come on making it appear
that the Committee at least does
not at all understand.

I do not want the Com-

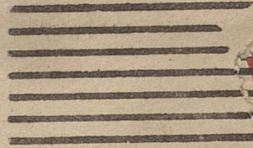
mittee to think that this Ch^h
or its pastor
is ungrateful for the help received in the past, nor that it is unwilling to help in this work. Hence I write this letter. It is meant for you personally — between you + me — If the Session desires to make its own official statement to the Com. it will do so next week or the week after — Yet of course I would like to have you use the information you have had for the past year + now again have brought to your mind in this letter in such way as to set

this church right in the
minds of the members
of the Committee. You
have had this informa-
tion from other sources
as well as from me in
private & this letter, &
hence will hardly need
to use this letter directly
tho' if you desire to use it
as a personal letter I do
not care —

Sincerely hoping & pray-
ing that the Cause may
be greatly prospered
thro' the blessing of the Mas-
ter & that there may be no
debit at meeting of Synod
