MANKATO, Minn.—A newspape written and edited by high school students, intended for national circulation and dedicated to the wor of increasing respect for the prohibition law among young people, an made its initial appearance here. I is believed to be the first publication of this type in the Unite

The paper, called the Student Marrican, is the organ of the Student Sobriety Society, a temperance club for high school boys that last year grew from a local organization of one chapter and 49 members at a national club of 18 chapters and 35 members, with members-atlarge in five states and the District of Columbia.

A statement in the first edition of the paper defines its purpose as threefold: to provide publicity for the Student Sobriety Society, to develop a new fact service in defense of the Eighteenth Amendment, and to provide a small revenue to carry on the purposes of the Student Solviety Society.

The first editorial, entitled "The Whispering Campaign," also states the purpose of the club.

"Under the shadows of a slanderous whispering campaign, many of the opponents of the Eighteenth Amendment are endeavoring to polson the minds of the people against the prohibition law by unfair and untrue statements that prohibition has degraded and debauched the youth of this country," the editorial states. "The young men have already risen against this practice forming the Student Sobriety Soforming the Student Sobriety So-

ciety, which needs your support."


