OWENSBORO — A 15-year-old student who had apparently had some problems with class-mates was charged with two fetoms was contained a loaded, saved-off shotgun with the stock removed; a loaded, 22-caliber, nine-shot revolver, sik nilves of varying lengths; and two homemade explosive devices, said Keith Cain, chief investigator for the Daviess County Sheriff's Department.

A University committee drafted a memorandum outlining six recommendations for policies it says warrant attention.

The recommendations, approved on Monday by the University Senate ad hoc Committee on the Status of Women (CSW), were divided into two groups—those "needing immediate attention" and those "needing attention as soon as readily possible."

Listed in the contents were proposals regarding staff maternity leave, cutbacks, expansion of the academic ombud's role, opportunity hires, restructuring of the Equal Opportunity Panel (EOP) and data gathering.




