

# Irregularities

Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, May 24, 1948.

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met in the President's Office at 10:30 a.m., Monday, May 24, 1948. The following members were present: Judge Richard C. Stoll, J. C. Everett, T. H. Cutler, Harper Gatton and R. P. Hobson. No member was absent. Meeting with the Committee were President Donovan, Secretary Peterson, and Mr. Guy A. Huguelet.

A. Approval of Minutes.

The minutes of the Executive Committee for March 16, 1948, were approved as published.

B. Bronze Plaques on Engineering Quadrangle.

President Donovan submitted a recommendation of the faculty of the College of Engineering for the naming of the Engineering Quadrangle.

The Faculty of the College of Engineering wishes to make a recommendation through you to the Board of Trustees:

Attention is called to the minutes of the Executive Committee of January 9, 1948, at which time approval was given to Dr. Chamberlain's report on the proposed erection of bronze plaques on the buildings which have been erected on the campus in the past ten or twelve years. In this list was included Anderson Hall, page 16, and South and East Unit, page 17.

It is recommended that these be deleted from the list and that the following be approved by the Board of Trustees:

1. That all of the buildings in the Engineering Quadrangle be named Anderson Hall in honor of F. Paul Anderson, and that a tablet be erected in the Main Corridor with suitable facts. The following is suggested.

## ANDERSON HALL

Named in honor of F. Paul Anderson  
Who served the University of Kentucky for forty-three  
years.

1891-1892 as Professor of Mechanical Engineering.  
1892-1918 as Dean of the College of Mechanical and Electrical  
Engineering.  
1918-1934 as Dean of the College of Engineering.

It was through his efforts that the College of Civil Engineer-  
ing, the College of Mechanical and Electrical Engineering, and  
the College of Mining Engineering were consolidated in 1918  
to form the College of Engineering. In recognition of his  
leadership in Engineering, he was chosen Dean, and served in  
that capacity until his death in 1934.

President Donovan recommended that the Executive Committee concur in the recommendation of the faculty of the College of Engineering, stating that, in his opinion, to do so would eliminate some of the confusion that now exists relative to names of the buildings of the quadrangle.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the recommendation was approved, and the bronze plaques were authorized erected and the buildings so named.

C. Return of Gift from Music Research Foundation, Inc.

President Donovan stated that the Music Research Foundation, Inc., Washington, D. C., had made a gift of \$1000.00 to the University for "the establishment of a library of musical selections of validated emotional connotation and significance." The work was to be conducted under the supervision of Dr. Alexander Capurso, head of the Department of Music.

Since receipt of the gift, Doctor Capurso has submitted his resignation, effective July 1, 1948, and will not be connected with the University, or available to supervise the work.

The Foundation has indicated its desire that the gift be transferred to Syracuse University or returned to the Music Research Foundation, Inc.

President Donovan recommended that the request be granted and the gift returned to the Music Research Foundation, Inc.

After general discussion, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Comptroller was directed to draw a check to the Music Research Foundation, Inc., in the sum of \$1000.00 as a refund of the gift.

#### D. Candidates for Degrees Approved.

President Donovan submitted the list of candidates for degrees at the June Commencement and recommended, subject to recommendation of the University Faculty, that the degree to which each candidate was entitled be authorized awarded.

E. Ordinance of City of Lexington concerning McLean Stadium.

## ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING PERMISSION TO THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY (UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY) TO PROJECT A PORTION OF THE FOOTBALL STADIUM ABOVE AND OVER THE SIDEWALK TO A POINT WITHIN TWO FEET OF THE SOUTH CURB LINE OF EUCLID AVENUE.

\* \* \* \* \*

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Kentucky (University of Kentucky) is the owner of the football stadium on the south side of Euclid Avenue, and,

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Kentucky (University of Kentucky) is now seeking to enlarge the stadium by adding additional tiers thereto, and,

WHEREAS, these additional tiers will by necessity overhang the sidewalk on the south side of Euclid Avenue about two feet for a distance of some two hundred and sixty-five (265) feet, and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners desire to grant to the Commonwealth of Kentucky (University of Kentucky) the permission necessary to allow this construction, the following ordinance is enacted:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Lexington:

Section 1. That permission be, and hereby is, granted to the Commonwealth of Kentucky (University of Kentucky) to construct additional tiers to the football stadium, which will overhang the Euclid Avenue Sidewalk to approximately two feet of the south curb line of Euclid Avenue, overhanging the sidewalk approximately 45 feet and beginning at a point 265 feet west of the intersection of Rose Street and Euclid Avenue and extending westwardly along Euclid Avenue a distance of 265 feet, said construction to be in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file with the City Engineer and Building Inspector of the City of Lexington, which plans and specifications are made a part of the ordinances as if copied herein.

Section 2. The said Commonwealth of Kentucky (University of Kentucky) in consideration of the permission herein granted agrees with the City of Lexington that it will assume all liability for any and all damage or injury that may result in any way from the construction and use of the said overhead tiers and indemnify and save harmless the City of Lexington

against any loss or damage resulting from the construction and use thereof, and will assume the defense of any claims whatsoever that may be brought against the City by reason of said construction and use. And the beginning of the construction will be the acceptance of these provisions in its entirety by the said Commonwealth of Kentucky (University of Kentucky).

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect when signed, recorded and published as required by law.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the ordinance and the opinion of the Attorney General were ordered received and made a part of the minutes.

F. Contract for Addition to McLean Stadium Approved.

President Donovan reviewed for the Executive Committee the action of the Board of Trustees at its meeting on May 3 on proposals to increase the seating capacity of McLean Stadium by approximately 23,000 seats. He recalled that the Board of Trustees rejected the bids received on April 29, 1948, and directed that the plans and specifications be so altered as to reduce the number of additional seats from 23,000 to approximately 10,600, and the elimination of plumbing and electric work and the press box.

He stated that the bids in response to re-advertisement for the erection of approximately 10,600 seats had been opened in public, tabulated, and made available for review.

The following bids were received on May 11, 1948, in accordance with revisions stipulated in Addendum under date of May 3, 1948:

President Donovan reported that his advisors recommended the acceptance of the low bid. He joined in the recommendation. A discussion of the five bids above enumerated followed.

President Donovan further reported that he had communicated with Governor Earle C. Clements and that it was Governor Clements' suggestion that the Board go ahead and award the contract with the understanding that the Building Commission would approve the Board's action.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the bid of the Perkins Construction Company, Frankfort, Ky., in the total sum of \$492,000.00 was accepted, and the contract was authorized executed by the proper authorities.

#### G. Contract for Campus Road Awarded.

President Donovan related that the University had secured from the Federal Works Agency combined shop and storage buildings erected on the Experiment Station farm east of Rose Street. The traffic to and from these buildings during the period of erection has severely damaged the existing farm road. He further stated that it was essential to have a road around the shop building for traffic and parking purposes.

The plans and specifications were submitted to the State Division of Purchases and Public Property, and, pursuant to our request, bids were taken on May 13, 1948, on request No. S 934.

Two bids were received subject to request, on a unit price basis, using an estimated quantity of each item.

The unit prices were checked by the Department of Business Management and Control, and by Mr. T. H. Cutler, member of the Board of Trustees and Director Engineer for Rural Highway Program of the State Highway Department.

Mr. Cutler stated that the unit prices were in line with prices received by the Highway Department for similar work and, in his judgment, reasonably in line with costs of current construction. He joined in a recommendation that the unit prices of Lehman-Roberts Company, Lexington, Ky., be accepted with Items 5 and 6 omitted. This eliminates the high type surface and finished dressing from the bid.

The Lehman-Roberts Company reported that they would be willing to accept the contract with Items 5 and 6 deleted.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the recommendation of the Department of Business Management and Control and Mr. Cutler was concurred in, and the Comptroller was authorized to prepare and execute contract with Lehman-Roberts Company, 615 Citizens Bank Building, Lexington, Ky.

#### H. Judge Stoll Resigns from Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees.

Judge Richard C. Stoll stated to the Committee that ill health had prevented him from attending recent meetings of the Executive Committee and meetings of the Board of Trustees, and that he thought it best to resign from membership on the Executive Committee.

He insisted that the Executive Committee accept his resignation as member and Chairman of the Committee. After discussing the matter with Judge Stoll, the Executive Committee reluctantly consented to his request.

Judge Stoll has been a member of the Board of Trustees for more than 50 years and Chairman of the Executive Committee for 30 years. During this entire period he has rarely missed a meeting of the Executive Committee or Board of Trustees. The members of the Executive Committee expressed to Judge Stoll their very great appreciation for his long and devoted service to the University.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the members accepted Judge Stoll's resignation as member and Chairman of the Executive Committee, and elected him as honorary member of the Executive Committee, and insisted that he attend the meetings of the Executive Committee whenever his health would permit him to do so.

Judge Stoll suggested that Mr. Guy A. Huguelet be elected to the Executive Committee and made Chairman.

J. Judge Stoll Withdrew from the Meeting.

Judge Stoll asked to be excused that he might return home and Mr. Huguelet assumed the chairmanship.
