January 7th The Faculty met at the usual hour. Mr. Ramsey was allowed to change his board to town and also to take fewer studies to allow him more time for some outside studies. Messrs. Guinness and Walker were honorably discharged. Mr. Wilson was directed to procure a ~~certificate~~ ^{from Dr. Dudley} certificate of inability to drill. An motion of Col. Whistler the Cadet Major was allowed a seat but no vote in the Faculty during the transaction of business pertaining to the military discipline of the College. The Faculty then adjourned.

January 24th The faculty met in called meeting at 12 o'clock in Drs. Patterson's room. The following resolution, offered by Prof. Everett was adopted - Resolved that in the opinion of the Faculty of the North College of N.Y. University the design of our College and its popularity and usefulness require that the military education and drill should be optional with the student after the close of this session; we hereby therefore request that the Executive Committee take the matter under advisement and give us, at an early day, its decision.

Mr. Trimble asked that his brother be excused from drill, if he should matriculate in this College. The request was granted, Profs. Shookleyford, Peter and Everett voting to excuse, Profs. Whistler and White voting not to excuse. J. H. Floete was appointed Cadet Major. On motion the Faculty adjourned.
