

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE - APRIL 5, 1937

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall Monday, April 5 with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of March 8 were approved as read.

Dean Wiest made a report on the meeting of the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business, which met in Baton Rouge.

Mr. Lysle Croft made a brief report on the guidance work with students in the lowest decile and those admitted from other institutions on probation.

The Graduate Faculty present the following recommendation:

"We recommend that degrees be conferred on the following persons - Dr. William Carpenter MacCarthy, Head of Surgical Pathology, Mayo Clinic and Professor of Pathology, Mayo Foundation, Graduate School of the University of Minnesota.

Honorable Albert Benjamin Chandler, Governor of Kentucky.

"Dr. MacCarthy was born in Louisville, Kentucky, June 10, 1880. He received the degree of Bachelor of Science from the University of Kentucky in 1900 and Master of Science in 1901. He was an instructor in botany in the University for one year and then went to John Hopkins where he received his medical degree in 1904. He was Assistant Pathologist in the Konigen Augusta Hospital in Berlin, Germany from 1904 to 1906. He came back to the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota in 1907 as Assistant Pathologist. Since 1909 he has been Head of Surgical Pathology at the Mayo Clinic and Professor of Pathology in the Mayo Foundation, Graduate School of the University of Minnesota.

"Dr. MacCarthy is an eminent authority in the field of pathology and bacteriology today. He is a member of the American Association for Cancer Research, the American Society for the Control of Cancer, the American Society of Clinical Pathologists, which he founded and of which he was a former president, the Osler Medical Historical Society, a fellow of the American College of Physicians, a member of the American Congress on Internal Medicine, and holds membership in a score of other medical organizations. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Sigma XI, Phi Gamma Mu, Alpha Kappa Kappa, and of Kappa Alpha.

"Governor Chandler was born at Corydon, Kentucky, July 14, 1898. He was graduated from Transylvania College in 1921 and was a student at the Harvard College of Law in 1921-22. He was awarded the Bachelor of Laws degree at the University of Kentucky in 1924. He has been practicing law in Versailles the major portion of his time since he graduated from the University of Kentucky. He was elected a member of the State Senate from his district in 1929. He was elected Lieutenant Governor of Kentucky for the term 1931-35 and was elected Governor of Kentucky in November 1935. Governor Chandler has started upon a reorganization of the state government of Kentucky. In the first year of his administration he placed the state upon a sound financial basis. His work is attracting nation-wide attention."

The question was raised that under present Senate rules, the names of persons recommended for honorary degrees were to be presented to the Senate at the March meeting and voted upon at the April meeting. Senate approved a motion that in this case the rule be suspended and the names recommended to the Board of Trustees for the degrees indicated.

President McVey made an announcement of the various dates of Commencement week. There was some discussion of the advisability of having a recessional. It was requested that anyone having suggestions regarding the Commencement give them to the Commencement Committee.
