April 7 1919

Dearest Pauline.

Here I am in the Navy but worse luck not even out of quarantine. This place is not what it is cooked up to be.

We have to scrub the barracks floor three times a day and drill five hours as well as burn up garbage. But perhaps I will not have to do this very long as our Petty Officer is sick in bed and I have his job at present. All the fellows in this barracks are in the hospital except two others and myself.

Dear do write me often as it is very lonesome up here.

I just was able to get a few minutes off this evening so I will not be able to say very much.
