Object of meeting: The awarding of first and second honor to the Graduates. The ballots being taken resulted in first honor (Valedictory) being awarded to Chas. Hoag, the second (Salutatory) to R. Anderson. On motion Cadet C. Brock is appointed as additional speaker on Commencement Day. Miss Annie Baker and Miss Maggie Wilson, candidates for graduation, are to be requested to read essays. Faculty then adjourned.

A. M. College, April 8<sup>th</sup> 1890

Faculty met in called session at 12 m. in President's room. All present. Object of meeting: Investigation of reported bad conduct of Cadets Anderson, Pugh, Mulligan and Pottinger in their way to Danville (oratorical courses) on April 4<sup>th</sup> a. c. at or near Bryan'sville, Ky. (Cases referred from Board of Discipline) The Charges are: Intoxication, shooting on the highway and into schoolhouse, disorderly conduct. After hearing the accused separately, Faculty decided as follows:

B. Anderson publicly dismissed

Pugh and Mulligan suspended to end of session

Cassidy suspended to end of session

Cadet Pottinger to be privately admonished by President.  
 Cadet Anderson to be publicly dismissed from College.  
 Cadets Mulligan and Pugh to be suspended to end of session  
 Cadet Cassidy (case from B. o. D.) charged with disobedience of orders, the charge having been proved, is suspended to the end of session.

A. M. College, April 9<sup>th</sup> 1890

Faculty met in called session at 1 P. M. in President's room. All present. Object of meeting to hear the father of Cadet Blythe Anderson (dismissed) in behalf of his son.

Mr. Anderson ca. appeared before the Faculty and made a statement in behalf of his son. After the withdrawal of Mr. Anderson Prof. Roark moves that the promulgation of the sentence against the three Cadets Anderson, Pugh and Mulligan be suspended, until the Faculty can get information from Bryanville, the Cadets meanwhile remaining away from College. No second. Prof. Walter Patterson moves that the case of Blythe Anderson be reconsidered. Seconded. Carried. Same moves that Anderson be suspended (instead of dismissed) to the end of the session. Seconded. - Carried. Prof. Helveti moves that the case of Cadet Mulligan be also reconsidered. Seconded. Motion lost. On motion, the case of Cadet Cassidy is taken up again, and his sentence is changed from suspension to end of session to the following: he is to be reduced to the ranks and walk post for 2 hours each day except Sunday, for two weeks.

There being no other business, Faculty then adjourned.

St. M. College, May 22<sup>nd</sup> 1890

Cadet J. D. Elbie  
dismissed.

Faculty met in called session at 1 P.M. in the President's room. Prof. Shankford takes the chair in absence of Pres. Patterson. There are present Prof. Shankford, Mark, Prewitz, Helveti, Pease, Roark, and Co. Clark. Cause of meeting: Charges against Cadet J. D. Elbie. Disobedience of orders. Mr. Elbie had failed to attend Inspection and Drill before the Inspector General W. S. A. on May 19<sup>th</sup> although ordered to do so. The B. o. D. has inflicted on him as punishment 4 days extra duty of two hours each, taking in consideration his previous good behavior. He refused to do the extra duty, and persisted in his refusal even before the Faculty. It being moved and seconded that he be dismissed, the motion was carried. - Cadet W. C. Millan, having failed to attend Inspection and Drill, the Board of Discipline gave him 22 extra duty (eight days of two hours each). Mr. Millan had so far failed to comply with the order, but was ready to do so. He was accused of having made false statements with reference thereto. After hearing his own statement,
