Displays illustrate physics' history



Pioneers: Artifacts displayed recall time when only UK and Yale used X-rays in tests

Each day students walk through the Chemistry-Physics Building past artifacts from the physics department's illustrious past. Jamie Burbrink, a psychology freshman, said she thinks the displays are interesting because they're from a different sea.

"If you pay attention, it's really interesting display," she said. Marcus McEllistren, professor emeritus in the physics and astronomy department, said the items on display were designed, built or used by some of UK's most famous scientists including Marry Lewis Pence. Karl Schneider and William S. Webb. McEllistren said the display exhibits glass tubes and other instruments used by Pence, including a fluoroscope used by his students to see X-rays of their own hands. Pence was the first chairman of the physics department. serving from 186-1914.

The X-ray was discovered in November 1865, and by January 1869. Fence was doing his own research, beginning UK's physics department.

"At that time, the only U.S. institutions working with X-rays were Yale and UK." McEllistrem said. "(Pence) put UK at the very frontier of radiation physics."

McEllistrem said Pence was among the first in the nation to use X-rays for medicine. Seeing an opportunity unique to Ken-

Ragland trial postponed

Attorneys request hearing to challenge tests

More than 18 months after he was arrested on charges of murdering UK honor student and football player Trent DiGiuro in 1994. Shane Ragland has yet to stand trial.

Ragland's trial, which was scheduled to start today, has been postponed to March 11.



Budget shortfalls don't justify cuts

General Assembly should not place long-run outlook in danger by focusing on short-term problems, cutting educational funds

In his State of the Commonwealth address last week, Gov. Paul Patton boasted that In his State of the Commonwealth address last week, GoV. Pair Fation loosted that overall enrollment in public universities has increased more than 15 percent since the enactment of the Council on Postsecondary Education's Improvement Act of 1997.

He also spoke extensively about the shortfalls besetting Kentucky in the current budget talks. These two items, taken together, beg the question: where to cur?

While state money has indeed taken a hit, UK President Lee Todd recently announced that tuition will not be raised mid-semester, which no doubt comes as a relief to

But tuition rates aside, what is the state's obligation to Kentucky's public universi-

ties, UK in particular? Where should higher education rank on the General Assembly's list of priorities?

list of priorities?

The governor, state legislators and most of Kentucky's elite support the idea of UK becoming a premier research institution. They have also advocated the need for the university to offer a quality education, as well as for graduates to remain within Kentucky.

But a simple truth stands between what our leaders say and what they do: UK's ability to reach those lofty expectations varies directly — although not exclusively — with the amount of funds dedicated to that end.

This fact has been the engine behind programs like "Bucks for Brains," but has apparently been lost at the first sign of fiscal uncertainty.

Patton already made some difficult decisions — trimming the cost-of-living adjustments for state employees, transferring some of the state's pension funds, etc. — but Kentucky's financial commitment to higher education should never be placed into question. Looked at another way, a corporation faced with a less-than expected bottom line.

Looked at another way, a corporation faced with a less-than-expected bottom line could choose to postpone research and development for a period of time. But doing so, even if the result is a healthy balance sheet for the next year, would place the long run health of the company in danger.

Likewise, we are all shareholders in the future of Kentucky. If that future is to be as bright so it is easily (and chould be. IIK will place a control role.)

More regulation is not the answer



Let me begin with some background to lend myself me credit I am a licensed, instrument rated variety library in the avaition industry, the "instrument rated" part just means that I'm trained to fly in the clouds and not pull a JFK Jr. I've been flying for nearly three years now, which means that when I began I was the same age as you guessed it — Charles Bishop.

Charles Bishop, if you don't know, was the 15-year-old Usama-loving student pilot who recently flew a small fourself in the past that the same training the same training to the past of the pas

Seat Cessna into the side of a I've worked at a local flight school for the past year. Unfortunately, Bishop's actions put the future of general aviation and the entire aviation industry at risk.

The media has jumped all over this story, trying to point a finger of blame at general aviation and flight schools in the wake of Sept. II. They are trying to make people fear aviation, which is something the public does not understand and many already fear.

My favorite coverage of the event so far came sev-

eral days ago when one CBS morning newsman interviewed the owner of the flight school where Charles Bishop received his flight training.

One of his first questions was something to the effect of, "In the wake of Sept. 11, is it not a breach of national security to give the keys of an airplane to a 15-year-old?"

All of the hundreds of thousands of licensed pilots, when confronted with this question, will give you the same answer: no.

when confronted with this question, as same answer: no.
First general aviation played no part in the attacks on Sept.11. The airplanes used were Scheduled Air Transport operations governed by 14 CFR (federal aviation regulations) Part 121 and operated separately from general aviation.

So, comparing it to general aviation is like compar-ing apples to oranges.

Secondly, the age of the student pilot has nothing to do with his actions and access privileges to airport ramp areas. A 30 or 45-year-old student pilot could have just as easily stolen the aircraft and flown it into a building.

a building.

Also, general aviation, and the industry as a whole, has an honesty not understood by the general public. Operating a \$150,000 piece of equipment requires extraordinary responsibility, which most will never experience, but all pilots are familiar with.

At any airport in this country, I, or any other licensed pilot, can undergo the procedures (generally a

one or two hour ride with a qualified instructor) and be given the keys to a \$150,000 airplane, yet I must be at least 21 to rent a car.

This system in general aviation has operated for years without incident. It is unfortunate that the actions of one young person, simply because of their resemblance to the attacks on Sept. 11, can put a damper on the hundreds of thousands of licensed and student pilots in the air today.


