

June 2, 1914

The faculty of State University met in special session, June 2, 1914, in the Reading Room of the Y.M.C.A., a quorum being present. In the absence of President Barker, who was attending a meeting of the Board of Trustees, Judge Chalkley was appointed to take charge of the meeting.

He requested that some one state the purpose of the meeting, but as no one volunteered to furnish the information, Prof. Anderson was requested to ascertain from President Barker the purpose of the meeting. On his return Prof. Anderson reported that Prof. Allen had requested a meeting and would state its purpose. Whereupon, Prof. Allen stated that the meeting was called to reconsider the granting of a degree to George B. Cary, and offered the motion that Mr. Cary's thesis for the degree of Mechanical and Electrical Engineering be accepted by the faculty and entered on the books in the Registrar's office.

Prof. Weaver asked whether the acceptance of this thesis by the faculty would not technically make Mr. Cary an alumnus of the institution, Prof. Allen replied that it would. A general discussion followed.

Judge Chalkley ruled that Prof. Allen's motion was out of order and that the faculty had no jurisdiction over this until it had been recommended by the Graduate School Committee.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
