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

Recommendations may break barrier for students, TAs

The Senate Council has recently made recommendations concerning foreign teaching assistants.

You know the situation — Johnny pays thousands of dollars to go to UK but is failing his class because he can't understand what his teacher is saying.

The policy states that a committee shall be formed each year to organize an orientation program for teaching assistants "prior to the beginning of the fall semester." The committee will help in training and evaluation of foreign teaching assistants.

Foreign teaching assistant candidates will have to score "at least 550 on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) exam." They must also score at least 250 on the Test of Spoken English (TSE) and be recommended by the orientation committee to the vice chancellor for academic affairs.

affairs.
Foreign teaching assistants who are not approved for teaching assignments "shall be assigned duties not requiring classroom student contact for a period not to exceed two academic semesters."

They will also be required to arrive on campus two weeks before the beginning of the fall semester. Each department using foreign teaching assistants shall conduct "a follow-up program of supervision and training of FTAs that is integrated with the overseeing of all teaching assistants. And one or more faculty is to be assigned to monitor and supervise FTAs."

Joblessness down in 112 counties

FRANKFORT, Ky. — Unemployment declined in 112 of the state's 120 counties during August as the number of Kentuckians with jobs was the third-highest in history, the Cabinet for Human Resources said in a report yesterday.

The decline reflected a plunge in the statewide unemployment rate from 9.2 percent in July to a preliminary 7.5 percent in August, which the cabinet had announced earlier. The August rate is subject to revision.

Ed Blackwell, the state labor market analyst, attributed the employment increases to seasonal factors such as the tobacco harvest and the opening of school.

Western Kentucky officials test home jail

PRINCETON, Ky. — Western Kentucky officials have been successful in two home incarceration experiments, but want to test the idea some more before broadening it. The concept allows prisoners to stay home under supervision, thus helping ease the overcrowded jails. Despite the success, Commonwealth's Attorney Bill Cunningham said the future of home jail hinges on more testing.

"I think law enforcement and maybe even the courts are still a little bit apprehensive of the program working." Since the 1986 General Assembly extended the home-jail concept beyond its experimental start two years ago in Kenton County, two men in western Kentucky have successfully completed six-month sentences at their homes.

Bill action slowed by summit concern

WASHINGTON — The Senate wrestled yesterday with the major spending bill of the new fiscal year, but the coming U.S.-Soviet summit was dampening prospects for

speedy enactment.

Trying to finish work by next week to head for the campaign trail, the Senate was keeping its \$556 billion spending package clean of amendments. In a series of ortees, it turned down proposals to add a sweeping new farm program, seniority protection for airline employees

d new rules for tenant-management of public housing.

Majority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kan., said he wanted pass the bill by the weekend, so compromise talks with the House could be completed early next week. Congress has given itself until Oct. 8 to approve the spending program for fiscal 1987, which began yesterday, under a stopgap spending measure signed into law by President Reagan.

S. African miners strike in protest

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — As many as 325,-000 black miners — more than half the workforce —stayed off the job yesterday in what union officials called a pow-erful display of worker strength in South Africa's largest

erful display of worker strength in South Africa's largest industry.

The one-day walkout, called to protest the 177 deaths in a Sept. 16 fire at the Kinross Gold Mine, cost the mines an estimated \$3.6 million, according to an academic monitoring group.

"This worker action is unparalleled in South African labor history and demonstrates the importance of worker safety at the work place," said Marcel Golding, spokesman for the 250,000-member National Union of Mineworkers.

South Africa threatens to stop buying grain if veto nullified

WASHINGTON — South African diplomats have been calling senators to threaten the cutoff of U.S. wheat purchases if the Senate over received respectively. 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
