NEW LIBRARY - NEW PROJECTIONS

The shape of the new library will be "like a square with the corners chopped off". The outside will not be of rosy stone, as suggested earlier, but will be mostly of brick with stone indentations at the "corners". The lower floor will have arches on all four sides.

The first floor will have the administrative offices (the DO), Tech services, Preservation, and the cafe (still reached from the OUTside), that is in addition to Circulation, of course.

Besides the traditional reading room, the second floor will have Reference, the Periodicals desk, Handicapped services and Current Periodicals.

The plans are still evolving, but some of the major details are now becoming clear. Keep reading this space for further developments.

HEALTH CARE USA

From 1950-1990 health care expenditures have grown from 4.4% to 13.2% of GDP.

LIBRARY ORDEAL FINALLY OVER

Someone sent in a clipping of a news item about Library Pollution:

"The main doors to the Library were reopened and circulation desk operations brought back to normal after health officials disposed of the stagnant water in an underground air duct that is believed to have been the source of bacteria that made 19 workers sick.

"The 3-week ordeal began on March 19 when employees began complaining of sore throats, nausea and dizziness." Both the library staff and Environmental Safety and Health officers were challenged to find the cause of the illness. One employee said "I felt like I had a terrific hangover ..."
In desperation, investigators tore up the threadbare rug from behind the circulation desk, suspecting a potential mold problem, and did tests on the air vents, to no avail. They finally discovered a pool of stagnant water underneath a crack in the duct system, which had soaked into fiberglass insulation and provided an hospitable environment for mold to grow. A nearby fan disseminated the contaminated air right around the heads of the circulation staff.
