

### White House should allow Nicaraguan peace plan a chance

Since the Central American peace accord was signed on Aug. 7, the Reagan administration has refused to endorse it because it did not force the Nicaraguan government to negotiate with the U.S.-backed rebels, known as contras.

Now the administration has no excuses.

Friday, Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega presented detailed plan for reaching a cease-fire in three weeks

a detailed plan for reatining a clear-first with the contras.

The plan calls for a cease-fire to begin on Dec. 5 and for rebel troops inside Nicaragua to move to one of three cease-fire zones. The rebels would lay down their arms on Jan. 5 before independent observers and then be granted

orrectives a clear willingness to reach peace in war-torn Central America.

But more importantly, Nicaragua is sending a message to the United States – Central American nations want to control their own destinies and keep the United States out

to the United States — Central American nations want to control their own destinies and keep the United States out of the region.

For too long, the Reagan administration has not trusted Nicaragua, but as Ortega said Friday while in Washington, this latest action is but more proof of the Sandinistas' willingness to obtain peace.

Since coming to power in 1979, the Sandinistas have sometimes worked to restore human rights. If the contras agree to the cease-fire proposal, we hope even more human rights be restored. The one reservation we do have is House Speaker Jim Wight's involvement in the peace process.

We understand his desire to have peace in the Western

We understand his desire to have peace in the Western Hemisphere, but Wright needs to remember that the United States can only have *one* secretary of state.

The Reagan administration is expected to ask for additional aid to the contras early next year. If the Central American peace process is to work, we hope Congress denies the White House's request.






