Mayor Jim Newberry appointed Bastin, who has worked in the Lexington Division of Police for 23 years, as the new chief of police yesterday, Bastin will take the post Jan. 6, when Beatty leaves the department.

"I feel like this is one of the best agencies in the country,"
Bastin said, "I'm happy to get the

opportunity to try to fill the shoes Chief Beatty has (filled) over the last six years."

Bastin currently commands the Bureau of Training and has workdin closely with Beatty. Mayor Ilin Newberry said those experiences allowed Bastin to become "inti-mately familiar" with the division of police.

Bastin said his close relation-ship with Beatty would help con-

Bastin said his close relationship with Beatty would help connect the UK and Lexington commenties and police agencies, adding that improving the relationship between local residents and students is a matter of addressing concerns from all sides.

"It's a matter of working with people to get to know the issues and understand the issues," he said. When Bastin first came to the force, police sometimes assumed until the community needed but the community needed but the community involvement, and the plans to continue that emphasis when he takes over as chief.

"With the talent we have in this department and the supportive community in Lexington, my vision is to make Lexington the safest city of its size in the nation," Bastin said.

Bastin was chosen by a nine-member committee of city officials and citizens that considered only internal candidates for the police-chief position. Among the three fi-nal candidates, Bastin was a clear choice, said Public Safey Com-missioner Tim Bennett, the com-mittee chairman.

"The committee was impressed by (Bastin's) vision of the chal-lenges our police officers will face in the future, and his plans to meet those challenges head-on," Bennett said.

Geography professor gains honor for research

A UK professor recognized for "unusually effective teaching" will give a lecture to the public today before devoting a year to research in Malaysia.

Thomas Leinbach, a geography professor and 2006-07 College of Arts and Sciences Distinguished Professor, will talk about his upcoming research in "A, Geographer at Work in Southeast Asia," which begins at 7 pm. in the William T. Young Library Auditorium.





■ THE HISTORY OF A HOLY MONTH

According to Islamic tradition, Ramadan is the month Allah revealed the Muslim holy book, the Quran, to the prophet Muhammad.

The ninth month of the Islamic year, Ramadan is the holiest month of the Muslim calendar. During Ramadan, Muslims fast from surrise to sundown and abstain from cursing, lying and other "impure" thoughts and actions.

Because it is based on the cycles of the moon, Ramadan starts on a different day every year. This year, Ramadan started Sept. 13 and will end either Oct. 12 or Oct. 13, depending on the cycles of the moon. Since Ramadan is a lunar month and not a regular calendar month, it begins about 11 days earlier each year. That means that during a Muslim's life, Ramadan will occur during both summer months, when they are longer, and winter months, when they re shorter.





Nample agrees. Cats typically like "ir-regular surfaces that they can get their grip on, such as textured wall coverings, furni-ture, carpeting and wood surfaces that are like trees."

Banfield, The Pet Hospital. If the cat likes to claw on things vertically, try scratching posts. Rubbing catnip on the surface of the post can entire your cat to use it.

"Most cats will start scratching the area you applied the catnip to — to release the odor more," says Ed Loebach, a veterinarian and quality assurance medical adviser at Banfield. The Pet Hospital, in Portland, Ore. He adds that young kittens aren't usually affected by catnip until later in life.

He also suggests you try a scratching post with materials that aren't found anywhere else in the house. That way, if the cat wants to get his claws in that texture, he would be drawn back to that scratching post. If your cat likes to scratch horizontally, scratch pads also are an option.

These can have various materials, such as corrugated cardboard, and may include eating. Besides providing an alternate location to scratch, you can make the soft and other areas you don't want your cat on tatack less attractive. You can use double-sided stickly tape or sandpaper on the spots favored for scratching.

Fletcher's absence unfair to students attending UK forum

While our generation is often criticized for political apathy, it was refreshing to see a strong turnout of students at the gubernatorial forum hosted by Student Government last Firday.

hosted by Student Government last Friday. Unfortunately, the enthusiasm and presence of the students and of the Democratic candidate for gover-nor Steve Beshear was not echoed by one critical party: the Republican candidate, Gov. Emic Fletcher. Fletcher's absence from the fo-rum, which his campaign communi-cations director Jason Keller said was because of "unavoidable scheduline"

cations director Jason Keller said was because of "inavoidable sending conflicts" in a Sept. 27 Kernel article, at best downgraded a healthy chate to a one-sided forum. At worst, it se-verely hurt Fletcher's pull among stu-dents and further antagonized those already cynical about the political system.

A scheduling conflict accom-

A scheduling conflict is one thing, but Fletcher's campaign knew for months that SG wanted to set up a debate between the candidates. "We've been in contact with both these offices since this summer, and that's more than enough time," SG President Nick Phelps said in a meeting with the editorial board on Monday.

We agree with Phelps. A candi-

day.

We agree with Phelps. A candidate running for the highest executive office in the state should not have to be persuaded to speak at that state's flagship university, particularly in a re-election year.

The governor should make it a priority, if not an obligation, to visit Kentucky's public universities if the expects this state's youth to have faith in him as leader.

One reason college students feel disentranchised from politics so easily is that they don't always realize how government actions affect them. The physical presence of these decision-makers speaking directly to students on issues that directly affect dents on issues that directly affect only for young speople. Not uniform the politicians to provoke interest and support in their policies and in the

democratic system.

It is truly a shame Fletcher's actions show he does not agree.

Whether his head or his heart was in the right place makes no difference. His person was not on UK's campus Friday at noon. And whether Beshear didn't see the value of such an interaction is also irrelevant. He showed up.

wed up. What's more, Fletcher did not is

plain his actions and exude his connidence that mysteriously pervades despite turning away from meeting with young citizens.

"Gov. Fletcher is very focused on postsecondary education," Keller said in the Kernel article. "We are confident that voters at UK will decide he is the right man for Kentucky for the next four year.

We, as an editorial board and as citizens who truly wanted to see the governor last Friday, are not so confident for Fletcher.

In a time of increasing tuition costs when UK is mandated by state government to reach top-20 status by 2020, and when Fletcher's original budget proposal in 2006 denied UK's full funding requests to help our school reach that goal, Fletcher has a long path to walk before he proves his focus and concern for students and for postsecondary education. A simple appearance would have gone far to show this, but scheduling got in the way.

Phelps has said he will continue to work to bring Fletcher to campus before the Nov. 6 election, saying SG would welcome him 'any day, any line.' It won't be an open debate, the continue of the

Blackwater's mercenary soldiers hinder U.S. progress in Iraq

Blackwater has been involved in
195 shooting incidents in Iraq since

Blackwater has been involved in 195 shooting incidents in Iraq since 2005, and in more than 80 percent of those cases Blackwater guards were thists to open fire, according to a U.S. congressional report. Additionally, in the majority of cases, the guards fired their weapons from moving vehicles without stopping to count the dead of a constitution of the constituti

The fact is, the United States al-most exclusively employs private

guards to protect U.S. diplomats and other officials outside of the safety zone; without these private security guards, U.S. diplomats would not be able to do their job.

To think that U.S. diplomats cannot do their job without the help of private security guards — not U.S. soldiers, mind you — one has to wonder, after five years of fighting and with over 100,000 U.S. soldiers in Iraq, just how little security there is in that country.

More pathetic, however, was the Iraqi government's feeble protest against the shooting and the practice of employing unaccountable private security teontractors.

Amid roaring public outrage, the Iraqi government initially revoked Blackwater's license to operate in Iraqi government initially revoked Blackwater's license to operate in Iraqi government initially revoked Blackwater's license to operate in Iraqi also resumed limited operations four days after the shooting. The firm was back in full operation within a week, according to BBC news.

Iraqi Prime Minister Nouri al-Malik caled the shooting a "criminal act" and an inquiry by the Iraqi interior ministry has concluded the security guards were "100-percent guilty."

Yet the Iraqi government cannot

Yet the Iraqi government cannot bring any charges on these Blackwater guards, mercenaries in effect, responsible for the reckless shooting, because private security contractors are not subjected to Iraqi law. That's a lap in the face of a country's sovereignty if there ever was one.

If a government doesn't even have the power to protect its people from foreign private armed guards, how is it expected to oversee a furbulent country?

What role has the United States

What role has the United States been playing in this sticky situation?

As "liberators" of Iraq, surely the United States would stand up for the people States would stand up for the peo-iberated, right?

In the past, U.S. diplomats once

helped a Blackwater employee leave Iraq less than 36 hours after he killed a bodyguard of one of Iraq's vice presidents while drunk. He faced no criminal charges, according to a BBC News article.

And in the Baghdad shooting incident, the U.S. State Department's approach is "to make monetary payments to put the matter behind us," the Congression of the properties of the state of the properties of the prop

and refuse to investigate such criminal actions.

Remember the Republicans' claims that the U.S. troops would be welcomed by the Iraqis upon entering the country? Well, even if it were true several years ago, there is no way on earth it can be true now.

Last year, the number of challenges — ranging from written complaints to full-blown hearings — jumped to 546, more than 30 percent higher than in 2005. Such annual fluctuations are not unusual, according to Judith Krug, head of the library association's office of intellectual freedom.






