

At N. College Jan 25th 1884

The Faculty met in called session at 12 M. in the President's room. Present were: The President, Prof Kirby, White, Menck, Shackleford, Tyler, Helbreli, Crandall, Neville.

Charges against Cadet R. A. Smith for disobedience of orders and refusing to go into arrest Jan 19th 1884. Cadet Smith, on being called states that he misunderstood the order to go into arrest, to apply for the following day, and that he obeyed the order given as soon as possible. With the consent of Col Tyler Prof. Shackleford moved that his explanation be accepted and Cadet Smith acquitted. Motioned and carried.

Petition of Cadets and Jones (H.C.) members of the Senior (graduating) Class who pray, that they may be allowed to graduate without taking Agricultural Chemistry (Prof. Menck), they having heretofore understood that the Study of Agr. Chemistry was elective, and that they lacked time to take it at this late day. By motion the Petition was referred to a Committee of three, Prof. Menck, Kirby and White, with instructions to report Monday, Jan. 28th.

The Committee, appointed Nov. 26th to establish a scale of demerits for students falling under 75% of perfect, recommend, that hereafter students falling below a weekly average, shall receive 3 demerits for each week so marked, provided that the Prof. in charge of the student's class may waive after the student's standing:

Weekly Demerits. N.D. i.e No Demerits, when he thinks, that the student has not failed from want of diligence or attention. This Rating was accepted and it was besides agreed that 50 demerits given to a good student, should be accounted equal to 100 dem. given to a Cadet.

The Faculty then adjourned to Monday Jan 28th 12. M. P. M. Helbreli

At N. College Jan. 28th 1884

Faculty met at 12 M. in the President's room in adjourned meeting (Jan 25th). The President and all the Professors were present. Prof. White, chairman of the Committee on Petition of Cadets Eubank, Riley & Jones

reports, that the class, from which these graduates wish to be excused, is obligatory in the first term of the Junior year, and that at the time, when they should have taken it, no Professor of Agr. Chemistry had been provided. Prof. Menck moves that they be required to take it now, in their Senior year. The motion was lost. The petition of Enbaur, Relye & Jones granted.

Prof. White moves that a Committee be appointed by the President to determine more definitely the conditions for graduating. Motion seconded and carried. The President announced that he would appoint the Committee in a few days. The Faculty then adjourned.

Object of meeting: Consideration of the reports of Board of Discipline against cadets Harvin, Lawrence, and Laurence, for visiting in quarters during study-hours, cadet Simmons, for absence from class without leave and cadet Masner, the same. After hearing the accused, it was decided that Cadets Harvin and Lawrence be confined to their quarters for one week, that Cadet Masner receive 10 tea demerits and that Cadet Simmons be ordered back to his class. The Faculty then adjourned.

Faculty met at 12 M. at the call of the President in his room. Present: The President, Prof. Tyler, Nield, Kirby, Shakerford, White, Randall, Helwick, Pina, Col. Tyler. Object of meeting stated by the President: Appeal of Cadet Lambuth from the decision of the B. of D. to the Faculty. Cadet Lambuth having refused to obey orders at Drill (Petr. 28th Capt. West commanding) was sentenced by B. of D. to two weeks confinement to his quarters. After hearing Cadet Lambuth and his witnesses, Cadets, Prentice, Hays, O'Bannion, Asher, Speyer, who substantially testify that on February 28th having
