

satisfied with the student's proficiency. When a student is required to do this additional work, the committee will report this requirement to the University registrar, who will indicate the fact on the student's record.

*Foreign Languages.* No student whose native language is other than English, and who has had formal instruction in schools of his own country, may be permitted to take elementary, intermediate, or conversation courses in that language.

*Unsatisfactory Scholarship and Attendance.* A student who is doing unsatisfactory work, or has excessive absences, is reported to the dean of the college in which he is registered. This student shall be under the special supervision of his dean. If after a suitable length of time it becomes apparent that no improvement is being made, the dean may drop the student from the course, reporting the action to the Registrar.

*Repeated Registration.* The head of a department may refuse to allow a student to register in a course for a third time (including correspondence and extension).

*Classification.* A student in any undergraduate college shall be classified by the University registrar as a sophomore when he has completed 28 credit hours, a junior when he has completed 60 credit hours and a senior when he has completed 90 credit hours.

A Law student shall be classified as a second year student when he has completed 24 credit hours and as a third year student when he has completed 58 credit hours. He shall not, however, be classified as a second year student until he has been in residence at least two semesters, nor as a third year student until he has been in residence at least three semesters.

A Pharmacy student shall be classified as a second year student when he has completed 28 credit hours and as a third year student when he has completed 56 credit hours.

*Classification of Transfer Students.* A student who transfers to the University as a junior and ranks in the lowest quarter on the entrance tests will be classified as a junior conditionally. The continuance of junior classification will depend on the student's making a standing of 2.0 or more, on his first semester's work.

*Special Examinations.* A student regularly enrolled in the University may be given a special examination for credit, provided the request for the examination is approved by the University Registrar, the dean of the college, and the head of the department concerned. Application must be made in writing to the Registrar.

An auditor in a course may not take an examination in that course for credit. A student who has failed a course may not take a special examination to remove the failure.

*Credit for work done by Extension and Correspondence.* Not more than 32 credit hours required for an undergraduate degree and not more than one-half of the requirements for a major may be gained by extension or correspondence.

Under certain conditions up to six credit hours and nine weeks of the residence required for a master's degree may be satisfied by extension work taught by University of Kentucky instructors. No credit will be given in the Graduate School or in the professional colleges for courses done by correspondence.

*Credit for work done at University Centers.* Credit for work done while registered at University Centers shall be limited to freshman and sophomore
