### Fake ID found on UK student killed in automobile accident

A fake ID was found on the body of a UK student killed Tuesday night in a one-car accident on Euclid Avenue, according to Lexington Police Sgt. Ted Hudson.
Lisa Whalen, 20, a UK junior from Edgewood, Ky, was riding with Brad Shipman, the driver of the car, and Michael Thomas Swerczek when Shipman's Camaro went out of control and struck a telephone pole.

"Fake IDs are a big problem at UK,"
Hudson said. "People are making and sel-ling them there, and then using them to buy alcohol. This accident is a classic example of how three lives can be ruined." Shipman, a 20-year-old UK junior, was not injured in the accident, police said. Swerczek was listed in critical condition with head injuries last night at UK Chandl-er Medical Center, a hospital spokeswo-man said. Swerczek, 20, also is a UK ju-nior.

"We cannot sacrifice the University for some of the other regional institutions," said Scorsone, who is a member of the House education committee. "We just simply do not have the money in this state. The University of Kentucky clearly has to be the highest prority."
