

#### UK's seven **NCAA** titles

# 1948

The "Fabulous Five" and coach Adolph Rupp won UK's first NCAA championship defeating Baylor 58-42. Cliff Barker, Ralph Beard, Alex Groza, Wallace "Wah Wah" Jones and Kenneth Rollins also won a gold medal playing on the 1948 U.S. Olympic team coached by Rupp.

# 1949

# 1951

UK won its third NCAA championship in fo championship in four years in a 68-58 win against Kansas State. Seven-footer Bill Spivey, an All-American, and Cliff Hagan led the Cats with 22 and 10 points. Frank Ramsey also starred for the Cats.

# 1958

Coach Rupp vowed to get back at the NCAA for placing the Cats on probabilities and eliminating the UK basketball team in 1953 and again punishing UK by keeping UK Grad students from playing the following year when the Cats were 25-0. It took a while, but the "riddlin" Five "won him his Attile in a 36-472 upsat over a Seattle team starring Elgin Baylor.

# 1978

After 20 years of ups-and-downs and coming close to winning the school's fifth championship, Joe B. Hall won his first. Jack "Goose" Givens scored an NCAA title game record 42 points as the Cats defeated Duke 94-88.

# 1996

UK suffered another title drought – this one lasted 18 years – but Rick Pitlino finally got the Cats back to the pinnacle of college basketball. UK beat Syracuse 76-67 and Tony Delk was named Final Four MYP.

# 1998

UK played in its third consecutive NCAA title game and brought the title game and brought the championship back to Lexington after a heartbreaking loss to Arizona year earlier. Tubby Smith won his first thampionship in his first year as UK coach after the "Comback Cats" came from 10 points behind at halfilme to beat Utah 78-69. Jeff heppard scored 16 and was named MVP.

# **Shooting for greatness**

**Issues:** Talented team must replace Parker and develop chemistry

The hard work and diligence Prince spoke of is necessary if the Cats hope to meet their expectations and those of the fans. But, they must also address three issues Smith highlighted at the news conference.

Smith said UK's talented and deep 15-member team must find chemistry, overcome the loss of sophomore center Jason Parker and replace Saul Smith at point guarant epides. Smith hinted that the need for team chemistry was the most important of these issues.

"Talent really doesn't mean a thing if you don't come together as a team and your chemistry's not right," he said. "More talent doesn't necessarily mean more wins or anything else."

Talent may not equal a 30-win season, but Smith's team will face criticism if it falls to better its two previous 24-win finishes.

This year's team has depth and talent at every position and two proven scorers in Bogans, who averaged 17 points per game, and Prince, who averaged 16.9.

Regardless of who emerges as UK's go-to-guy in the paint and who will handle the ball for UK, the waves of expectations will continuously pound the Cats.

Team chemistry is vital if the Cats are to meet these expectations and, if their expressed goal is any indication, a winning alchemy could already be brewing.

"I probably won't try to muscle with them, I try to use my quickness with those guys," he said.



Last year the duo account-ed for 42.5 percent of UK's of-fense and Bogans said he and Prince will be two of the na-

"I feel like we're the best 1-2 punch in the country and I think we're going to show it as soon as the season starts," he said.

Bogans ability to score has never been questioned, but some critics argue that he's too concerned with improving his NBA stock and receiving individual accolades than leading UK to its eighth national title. However, Bogans downplayed the hype that he might be jealous of Prince, who was nominated for multiple Player of the Year awards.





Shop around: Convenience store prices make shopping for groceries on campus more expensive than shopping at off-campus markets

Campus convenience stores are meant to be just that - convenient. But some students at UK wonder if that extra convenience justifies higher prices.

To find out just how much

justifies higher prices.

To find out just how much extra shopping on campus costs, the Kernel selected 11 items from the Commons Market. Prices, which did not reflect any sale prices, were checked and then compared with identical items at the Kroger store on Euclid Avenue. Nine of the 11 items were less expensive at the Euclid Kroger. The total of the 11 items was \$6.18 less than at the Commons Market be Kernel checked the prices of the same 11 items at the Meijer store on Reynolds Road, 10 of the 11 items were less expensive at Meijer. The total of the 11 items at the Reynolds Road Meijer was \$11.01 less than at the Commons Market.

Carol Raitz, director of Cam-

LOUISVILLE — City officials agreed not to
enforce the city's 3-foot 'buffer zone' between exotic dancers and patrons until a legal challenge is
resolved in December. City officials and attorneys for dancers and strip-club owners reached
the agreement after federal lawsuits were filed
against the city hours earlier Tuesday. The lawsuits challenge the constitutionality of the city's
nude-dancing ordinance. Plaintiffs asked U.S.
District Judge John Heyburn II to issue a temporary order barring enforcement of the law. Heyburn proposed an agreement that temporarily
ends the 3-foot rule while allowing other portions
of the ordinance, such as dancer-licensing procedures, to remain. The lawsuits will be heard Nov.
13-15 but won't be decided until at least Dec. 11.
Heyburn said.

### Trooper shoots armed suspect in leg

Trooper shoots armed suspect in leg RICHMOND — A Kentucky State trooper shot an armed suspect in the leg, according to a report from the Richmond post. Trooper Jeremy Silnker identified himself to Rickey L. Short. 20, of Richmond, and was threatened with a shotgun Tuesday night, according to Trooper Mike Coyle. Slinker drew his revolver and fired, wounding the suspect in the left thigh, Coyle said in a report. Short was arrested and charged with three counts of wanton endangerment and lodged in the Madison County Detention Center, Coyle said. Slinker was sent to investigate when a motorist reported that he and his girlfriend had just been fired at by another driver. Coyle said. Other motorists also offered information about the incident on Kentucky 52. three miles west of Richmond. According to state police, Slinker drove to the area and went to Short's house, where the confrontation occurred. Short was treated for the wound and taken to jail, the report said.

#### Judge says crisis management needed

MIAMI — A federal judge suggested Wednesday that the Postal Service needs to recruit someone like retired Army Gen. Barry McCaffrey to 
lead a crisis management team on its anthrax response. U.S. District Judge Patricia Seitz doesn't 
have the power to order that, but she set a hearing Friday on a request by the American Postal 
Workers Union local in Miami to force the Postal 
Service to quickly address worker protection is-Workers Union local in Miami to force the Postal Service to quickly address worker protection issues. Union attorney Neil Flaxman complained to the judge that he hadn't been able to 'herd the cats together' to get action. Four other Florida facilities are among 200 being tested nationally for anthrax, said Postal Service spokesman Joseph Breckenridge. Five in Palm Beach County have tested positive since the death of a Boca Raton supermarket tabloid editor, the first anthrax victim since the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks.

# Pentagon may call up more reservists WASHINGTON — The Pentagon expects to call up more reservists than the 50,000 originally believed needed for the war on terrorism, officials said Wednesday. Most will be reporting for homefront duty. The increase reflects heightened concern about potential terrorist attacks on federal installations as well as an expanding war effort in Afghanistan, where U.S. planes bombed military targets for a 25th day. Reviewing progress in the bombing campaign, Rear Adm. John Stufflebem told a Pentagon news conference that attacks have so severely damaged the Taliban's military communications system that commanders in the field are having trouble summoning new supplies and troop reinforcements. "We believe that puts a terrific amount of stress on their military capability." he sometime of the commanders o

Pentagon may call up more reservists

Bush admin toughens arsenic standard Bush admin toughens arsenic standard WASHINGTON — Reversing course, the Bush administration will accept a new, tougher arsenic standard for drinking water that was issued in the last days of the Clinton presidency. Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Christie Whitman said the decision will reduce the maximum of arsenic allowed in drinking water from 50 parts per billion — a level first set in 1942 — to 10 parts per billion — level first set in 1942 — to 10 parts per billion by 2006. Former President Clinton had adopted the tougher standard of 10 ppb three days before leaving office. The Bush administration suspended that action and set it back to 50 ppb, citing at least \$200 million in new costs to local communities and questioning the scientific basis behind the new standard.

School stops drug-sniffing dogs
LORDSBURG, N.M. — In a settlement of a lawsuit, the Lordsburg school system agreed to stop subjecting students to searches by drug-sniffing dogs. The lawsuit filed by attorneys for the American Civil Liberties Union had argued that the searches violated students' constitutional right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizure. A hearing was scheduled for Monday but school officials decided before that to settle the case. In addition to stopping the use of dogs, they agreed to pay plaintiffs' attorney fees and costs. School officials decided the dogs were no longer necessary because of other effective ways of seeking out drug possession, such as observation of student behavior, said Charles Hayes, superintendent in the 800 student district. During the searches, conducted randomly since 1997, a targeted school was placed under lockdown and a dog, restrained on a leash, walked up and down rows of students who were seated at their desks. 

Ala. — Two federal lawsuits were filed Tuesday afternoon seeking removal of the Ten Commandments monument from the rotunda of the Alabama Judicial Building. One lawsuit was filed in U.S. District Court in Montgomery by the Southern Poverty Law Center on behalf of Montgomery attorney Stephen Glassroth. That lawsuit claims the 5,280 pound monument "constitutes an impermissible endorsement of religion by the state." The other was filed by Americans United for Separation of Church and State and by the American Civil Liberties Union of Alabama.

"Lexis-Nexis is introduced a lot in English 101 and Communications 252 classes," Carrington said.
Lexis-Nexis is a large search engine that contains quick links to databases. UK subscribes to the Lexis-Nexis Academic Universe, which is a branch of Lexis-Nexis. The service is filled with reference materials such as court case records, laws, newspaper articles and business reports.
This fall marks the hearing

This fall marks the begin-ing of the third year UK has subscribed to the service, said Judy Fugate of the William T. Young Library Collection De-velopment Department.
For access to the search en-gine, UK pays around \$86,000 per year, equivalent to about \$1.50 per full-time student. Richard Labunski, an asso-ciate journalism professor, uses Lexis-Nexis on a regular basis in his courses.

"I think Lexis-Nexis is well worth the money. I wish more students used it, but I think that as professors and the staff of the library continue to publi-

cize its existence, more students and faculty will feel comfortable working with it. Labunski said.

He encourages students to use it to view state court cases.

Bradley Carrington, a reference librarian at Young Library, said Lexis-Nexis is the best database for students to use when researching newspers. The search engine contains full text articles from The New York Times, The Washington Post and other major newspapers. It also includes articles from foreign newspapers. Neither Fugate nor Carrington anticipate UK will succeive in the near future.

When Lipka needed her leadership on defense, she gladly moved back to sweeper.

"Annie really is, if not the top, one of the top players to players," Lipka said. "She is the type of player everyone will remember just like Carrie Landrum, who earned SEC Player of the Year in 1995."
