

Resurvey'd for Albert Gallatin

The annexed survey, situate on the waters of the Ohio Adams County Ohio beginning at a stake in an old line (the timber called for not to be found) thence N 89 1/2 W 334 poles to an ash & large white Oak near a drain (the White Oak dead) passing a Clay lick & marked buck at 150 poles thence North 262 poles to an ash & dead white oak (the sugar not to be found) thence East 334 poles to a stake no. corner to be found thence South 259 poles to the beginning containing 540 acres 106 poles

N<sup>o</sup> 551. This survey is situate on the road from West Union to the mouth of Gabber Creek about 3 miles west of Manchester about one half is good farming land the balance very hilly only of value for the timber - only one corner answering the description to be found but the claim established by the Clay lick & marked buck called for in one of the lines;

Patent for 500 acres issued on 3<sup>d</sup> April 1804 to Albert Gallatin

on survey dated 10 March 1794

and bounded by Patent as followeth vizt on the waters of the Ohio

Beginning at an Ash, Buck eye, and small Beach, thence

West 320 poles (passing at 100 poles two beeches, on the West side of a branch near a clay lick, marked I. Obannon IHA. CEV. ES. WR) to a large white oak & Ash near a drain

North 250 poles to two Ashes & a Sugar tree

East 320 poles to two Sugar trees

South 250 poles to the Beginning

Note I suspect the Beginning corner & the eastern line of the Survey to be about 30 poles East of the place where Light began & that the original survey contains near 600 acres
