

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, August 21, 1990.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 1:00 p.m. Lexington time on Tuesday, August 21, 1990 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

A. Meeting Opened and Oath of Office Administered

Mr. Foster Ockerman, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m., and the invocation was pronounced by Judge Henry Wilhoit.

Mr. Ockerman stated that he was pleased to inform the Board that Mr. Sean Lohman had duly been elected to another year as a member of the Board of Trustees. He indicated that Mr. Lohman did not need to take the oath of office since it had previously been administered to him. Mr. Ockerman expressed assurance that Mr. Lohman would continue to do a good job, and Mr. Lohman was given a round of applause.

Mr. Ockerman welcomed Professor Carolyn S. Bratt, faculty representative from the College of Law, and Mr. Daniel C. Ulmer, Jr., Chairman of the Board of Citizens Fidelity Bank and Trust Company, to the Board and asked Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel, to administer the oath of office, following which they were given a round of applause.

Professor Bratt was elected by the University System faculty and replaces Professor Mary Sue Coleman. Her term will expire June 30, 1993.

Mr. Daniel C. Ulmer, Jr. was appointed by Governor Wallace G. Wilkinson and replaces Dr. Nicholas J. Pisacano. His term will expire June 30, 1994.

B. Roll Call

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. Foster Ockerman (Chairman), Mr. Ted B. Bates, Professor Raymond F. Betts, Professor Carolyn S. Bratt, Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Senator Walter D. Huddleston, Mr. Sean Lohman, Professor Judith Rhoads, Mr. James L. Rose, Judge Robert F. Stephens, Mr. Jerome A. Stricker, Mr. William B. Sturgill, Mr. Daniel C. Ulmer, Jr., Mr. Billy B. Wilcoxson and Judge Henry R. Wilhoit, Jr. Absent from the meeting were Mr. William E. Burnett, Jr., Governor Albert B. Chandler, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Dr. Robert P. Meriwether, and Judge Julia K. Tackett. The University administration was represented by Interim President Charles T. Wethington, Jr.; Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth and Robert E. Hemenway, Jr.; Acting Chancellor Ben W. Carr, Jr.; Vice Presidents Edward A. Carter and Eugene Williams; Acting Vice President Dr. Leonard K. Peters; and Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel.

Members of the news media were also in attendance. A quorum being present, the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 1:06 p.m.

C. Approval of Minutes

Mr. Ockerman stated that the Minutes of the June 19, 1990 Board of Trustees meeting had been distributed and asked for any corrections or additions. The Minutes were approved as circulated.

D. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

Interim President Wethington reported that private gifts in 1990 were coming in at a record pace of \$15.4 million for the first seven months of the year and that the faculty and staff brought in \$69,682,092 in grants, contracts and gifts from external sources in the 1989-90 fiscal year. He noted that the institution is continuing to make very good progress in both of these fundraising areas.

He also called attention to the following items in his report:

1. The University staff is exploring sites in Western Kentucky for graduate programs.
2. Hughes Aircraft Company is the first tenant of the Coldstream Research Campus.
3. Lexington Community College has been expanded to the east side of Lexington due to an increase in enrollment.
4. The University Hospital has dedicated a critical care center in the hospital to serve the University and East Kentucky.
5. A report on the status of minorities in the University of Kentucky has been circulated and is being actively considered and studied by the Cabinet.
6. The University of Kentucky has received the first phase of the \$200,000 Keeneland professorship.
7. Kinder-Care, a child-care facility where students, faculty and staff receive preferential enrollment treatment, was dedicated on August 5.

Interim President Wethington then referred to the ten-point agenda for the Lexington Campus to implement the University's Strategic Plan and called upon Chancellor Hemenway.

Chancellor Hemenway reviewed the ten-point Lexington Campus agenda. He stated that the agenda will be the method by which the Lexington Campus will implement the University's Strategic Plan. The task for the Lexington Campus will be to see that the goals are organized with emphasis on making the University of Kentucky a better University. He explained that the premise of the agenda is a belief

in incremental change -- "many people making small changes day-by-day can result in significant large changes for an institution over time." He reported that there are approximately 1,100 faculty, 4,000 staff, 16,000 undergraduate students, and 3,600 graduate students on the Lexington Campus with approximately 3,300 students graduating each year. He noted that this is accomplished in 779 buildings and with a \$255,000,000 budget.

Chancellor Hemenway stated that the Lexington Campus agenda is an attempt to provide (1) a direction for the future, (2) a sense of purpose, (3) a focus for discussion, and (4) a basis for decision-making. After elaborating on each of these items, he stressed that the agenda for the Lexington Campus exists within the three major goals of the University's Strategic Plan: strengthen scholarship and academic excellence, exert a leadership role in addressing particular challenges for the Commonwealth, and strengthen the stewardship of the University's resources.

He commented on strengthening scholarship and academic excellence. In accomplishing this goal, he pointed out that the University needs to focus on articulating values, increasing research and improving teaching.

Chancellor Hemenway mentioned several areas that have been identified in addressing particular challenges for the Commonwealth, the nation, and the world. He stated that there is a need to alleviate the labor shortage, particularly in scientific personnel in this country, and pointed out that the University must prepare people who will be the faculty of tomorrow. Furthermore, the University campus must be internationalized and focus on the traditional service mission of a land grant university, transferring knowledge and technology.

Chancellor Hemenway stated that in strengthening the stewardship of the University's resources, the Lexington Campus plans to focus on (1) developing human resources, (2) achieving benchmark salaries for faculty and staff, (3) providing benefit packages for the employees of the future, (4) conserving fiscal resources, and (5) improving the physical environment. He stressed that the Lexington Campus needs to set priorities. He stated that much of the Lexington Campus agenda can be accomplished without adding money. However, there are some costs associated with the Lexington Campus agenda, and the University will need legislative appropriations for full program improvement. He stated, however, that the Lexington campus was beginning a process of reallocating resources to accomplish the agenda. During the 1990-95 period, the campus will create an innovation and excellence budget equal to 1% of the campus's base budget, and these funds will be committed to the agenda's goals. When this effort is matched with legislative support, major strides can be made for the University.

In conclusion, Chancellor Hemenway stated that if the Lexington Campus has been successful in adopting its agenda, it will be known as the campus that "includes" rather than excludes. After summarizing the proposed accomplishments for the Lexington Campus, he reiterated the size of the Lexington Campus and stated that it is a large part

of a large complex organization called the University of Kentucky. It is the University with the greatest resources to make a difference in the lives of Kentuckians, and by serving the Commonwealth, the University can become a comprehensive university of the first rank.

The ten points of the Lexington Campus agenda were shared with the Board:

1. Articulate values
2. Increase research
3. Improve reaching
4. Alleviate the labor shortage
5. Internationalize the campus
6. Transfer our knowledge and technology
7. Develop our human resources
8. Conserve fiscal resources
9. Improve the physical environment
10. Set priorities

Interim President Wethington noted that there are three primary academic areas headed by chancellors. The Chancellor of the Lexington Campus, Robert Hemenway, has provided a very good summation of the kinds of priorities he sees for his area. At a future Board meeting, the Chancellor for the Medical Center, Peter Bosomworth, will talk about the rural health initiative. And, before the end of the year, there may be a report from the Community College System, the third large piece of the University in terms of students and faculty.

E. Comments from the Chairman of the Development Council

Mr. Sturgill, Chairman of the Development Council, commented on the fundraising activities. He stated that everyone is very proud of the recent announcement concerning the \$70 million in grants and contracts generated by the faculty for research in fiscal year 1989-90. He also expressed pleasure in the private giving program. He reported that through June 1990, the University has raised \$15.4 million as compared to \$9.2 million through the same period last year. He informed the Board that there are 318 fellows for the year thus far compared to 260 this time last year. He reported that this is the 25th year of the fellows program and there are 2,500 active fellows in that program. He noted that this is a compliment to Interim President Wethington for his tour of duty as interim president of the University and publicly thanked each of the alumni and friends, corporate citizens, and all foundations who made it possible.

Mr. Ockerman thanked Mr. Sturgill for his report. He stated that the Development Council works hard and does a great job for the University.

F. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

Interim President Wethington stated that PR 2 reflects the routine personnel items which have been carried out since the last meeting of the Board and reflects those items which the Board must approve by the University regulations. He recommended approval of

PR 2. Mr. Stricker so moved. The motion, seconded by Senator Huddleston, carried. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Amendments to University of Kentucky Retirement Plan (PR 3A) and Incentive Retirement Plan (PR 3B)

Interim President Wethington stated that PR 3A and PR 3B reflect changes in the retirement program of the University of Kentucky. They are, however, separate action items. He called upon Mr. Carter, Vice President for Administration, to brief the Board on both items.

Mr. Carter stated that PR 3A is an amendment to the existing retirement program of the University of Kentucky and is brought to the Board after great study by the Cabinet. The proposed revision should meet four objectives:

1. It will simplify the overall retirement program of the University of Kentucky.
2. It will offer an enhancement to a large number of long term employees in terms of a better and more flexible retirement program.
3. It will enhance the administrative flexibility of the personnel component of the University of Kentucky.
4. It brings the University into a more competitive position with retirement programs, similar to those the state operates under the federal government and many other corporations and agencies.

After reviewing the current plan and the proposed recommendation, he noted that this change in the retirement program would be on-going as it is presented to the Board.

Mr. Carter then provided an explanation of PR 3B. He pointed out that this recommendation is for a one time Incentive Retirement Plan. This proposed one time window of opportunity effective August 21 would cease on December 31, 1990. He noted that there are about 60 to 70 employees both faculty and staff who would be eligible for this plan. He reviewed the recommendation as outlined in PR 3B.

Mr. Stricker asked for verification that this is a one-time incentive to one group of employees and it would not increase the budget.

Mr. Carter verified that there is no anticipated additional fund requirements to do the buy-out provisions. The health insurance contribution, however, goes on as it does for all retirees.

Interim President Wethington recommended to the Board that the Amendments to the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan be incorporated into the Administrative Regulations in terms of the

revisions in PR 3A. Judge Stephens so moved. The motion, seconded by Professor Rhoads, passed. (See PR 3A at the end of the Minutes.)

Interim President Wethington then recommended that a one-time Incentive Retirement Plan be offered to regular full-time active employees who are age 65 or older and have a minimum of 15 years of full-time service as of August 21, 1990. Service, though it need not be continuous, must be as a result of a regular appointment at the University of Kentucky. On motion made by Judge Stephens and seconded by Mr. Wilcoxson, PR 3B carried. (See PR 3B at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Candidates for Degrees - Community College System (PR 4A)

With Interim President Wethington so recommending, on motion made by Mr. Sturgill, seconded by Professor Rhoads and passed, the routine recommendation for approval of degrees specified in PR 4A was approved. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Candidates for Degrees - University System (PR 5A)

With Interim President Wethington so recommending, Professor Bratt moved that the list of candidates for degrees in the University System as recommended in PR 5A be approved. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and carried. (See PR 5A at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Appointment of Dean of Undergraduate Studies (PR 5B)

Interim President Wethington stated that PR 5B is the recommendation that Dr. Louis J. Swift be named Dean of Undergraduate Studies effective July 1, 1990. He called upon Chancellor Hemenway to comment on the appointment.

Chancellor Hemenway expressed pleasure in recommending Dr. Swift as the candidate to be named Dean of Undergraduate Studies. He briefly reviewed his credentials and stated that Dr. Swift has been the guiding force behind the University Studies Program, particularly the revision of that program.

With Interim President Wethington so recommending, Professor Bratt moved that Dr. Swift be named Dean of Undergraduate Studies. Mr. Lohman seconded the motion and it passed. Dr. Swift was asked to stand and be recognized, following which he received a round of applause. (See PR 5B at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Appointment of Director of the University of Kentucky Center for Business and Economic Research (PR 5C)

Interim President Wethington recommended that Dr. Charles F. Haywood be appointed Director of the University of Kentucky Center for Business and Economic Research, effective July 1, 1990. On motion made by Professor Betts, seconded by Mr. Rose and carried, PR 5C was approved. (See PR 5C at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Appointment of Director of the University of Kentucky Art Museum (PR 5D)

Interim President Wethington stated that PR 5D is the appointment of the Director of the University of Kentucky Art Museum. He expressed pleasure in recommending that Dr. Harriet W. Fowler be appointed Director effective July 1, 1990. The motion, which was made by Professor Betts and seconded by Professor Bratt, was voted on and unanimously carried. Dr. Fowler was asked to stand and be recognized, following which she received a round of applause. (See PR 5D at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Appointment of Director of the Gluck Equine Research Center (PR 5E)

Interim President Wethington stated that PR 5E is the appointment of the Director of the Gluck Equine Research Center. He reported that the Gluck Center had moved forward during the last few months and this is partly due to the good leadership of Dr. Peter Timoney who has been acting director during that time. Following a considerable search over several months, there is good consensus that supports the recommendation of Dr. Peter Timoney as Director of the Gluck Equine Research Center effective July 1, 1990.

Mr. Bates stated that for the first time, in his opinion, the Gluck Equine Research Center has leadership commensurate with its potential. He so moved that Dr. Timoney be appointed Director. Mr. Sturgill stated as a member of the Equine Research Board he supported Mr. Bates' remarks and seconded the motion. The motion carried. Dr. Timoney was asked to stand and be recognized, following which he was given a round of applause. (See PR 5E at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Appointment to University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation (PR 5F)

Interim President Wethington recommended that approval be given to the appointment of Richard C. Harris to membership on the Board of Directors of the University of Kentucky Mining Engineering Foundation for a term ending June 1992. On motion made by Mr. Rose, seconded by Mr. Stricker and carried, PR 5F was approved. (See PR 5F at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Naming of University Facility (PR 5G)

Interim President Wethington indicated his pleasure in recommending that the Board approve the name of Garrigus Building for the Agricultural Science Building--South. The motion, which was made by Judge Stephens and seconded by Mr. Lohman, was voted on and carried unanimously. (See PR 5G at the end of the Minutes.)

P. New Academic Degree (PR 6A)

Interim President Wethington stated that PR 6A recommends that the Board authorize the awarding of the new degree of Master of Science in Physical Therapy to those students who satisfactorily complete the requirements for that degree as approved by the

University Senate. He reviewed the background information and recommended its approval. Mr. Wilcoxson so moved. The motion, seconded by Mr. Bates, passed. (See PR 6A at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Appointments to University of Kentucky Tobacco and Health Research Foundation (PR 8A)

Interim President Wethington stated that PR 8A is a recommendation that approval be given to the appointments of Pat McCuiston, Sandra Wood, Glenn B. Collins, William Lubawy, D. Layten Davis, B. Sory Fletcher and Robert Krell as members to the Board of Directors of the University of Kentucky Tobacco and Health Research Foundation for a four-year term beginning September 1, 1990 through June 30, 1994. He reviewed the background information and expressed pleasure in recommending the appointments. Mr. Sturgill so moved. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and carried. (See PR 8A at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Disposal of Personal Property (FCR 1)

Mr. Ockerman, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that FCR 1 is a routine resolution which relates to the disposition of surplus and obsolete equipment. On motion made by Mr. Wilcoxson, seconded by Mr. Ulmer and carried, FCR 1 was approved. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

S. Report of Leases (FCR 2)

With Mr. Ockerman so recommending, Mr. Stricker moved approval of the report of leases. His motion was seconded by Judge Stephens and carried. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

T. Repeal of International Student Fee (FCR 3)

Mr. Ockerman reported that after much discussion by the Finance Committee FCR 3 was changed to read that "the fee be suspended for the current academic year during which period of time it will be further reviewed and subject to further action of the Board." If the Board did not wish to make a change, the suspension would terminate at the end of one year. Mr. Lohman moved that the Board suspend the International Student Fee for the 1990-91 academic year. Mr. Sturgill seconded the motion and it passed. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

Mr. Ockerman noted that a report would be made to the Board before August, 1991.

Interim President Wethington stated that it is the administration's intention to review the whole question of the need for a fee for international students as well as the services being provided to them. He indicated that there will be student involvement in any recommendation that comes before the Board.

U. Patent Assignment (FCR 4)

Mr. Ockerman reported that FCR 4 is a routine patent assignment in accordance with the University's policy and is recommended for approval by the Finance Committee. Mrs. Hayes so moved. The motion, seconded by Senator Huddleston, was voted on and passed. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

V. Report on Investments (ICR 1)

Mr. Stricker, Chairman of the Investment Committee, reported that the Investment Committee had met and reviewed the report of investments. It is a routine report of changes and adjustments in investments for the University and its affiliated corporations for the three months ended June 30, 1990. He called attention to a new program dealing with short-term investments with the Commonwealth of Kentucky Office of Financial Management and Analysis. He moved approval of ICR 1. The motion, seconded by Professor Betts, carried. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

W. Comments by Professor Betts

Professor Betts stated that it would be most appropriate if the Board went on record congratulating Dr. Guy Davenport for his receipt of the McArthur Fellowship. The McArthur Fellowship is the most prestigious and unusual fellowship that is awarded. After explaining the selection process, he stated that it adds to the reputation of the institution and speaks well to the quality of scholarship and academic activities that take place on the University campus. He, therefore, asked that the Board go on record offering Dr. Davenport its most hearty congratulations. Professor Bratt seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

X. Presidential Search Committee Meeting

Mr. Ockerman reported that the Presidential Search Committee would meet shortly after the adjournment of the Board meeting. He expressed thanks to the Committee for all the work they have done and will do between August 21 and September 18. The Committee proposes to have completed its work by that date and will have a report to make to the Board on September 18. He noted that the election of a President of the University will be a subject for action at the Board meeting on September 18 and asked that everyone be present.

Y. Meeting Adjourned

There being no further business to come before the Board, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 1:56 p.m.

AMENDMENTS TO UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY RETIREMENT PLAN

Recommendation: that the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan as incorporated in the Administrative Regulations (AR II-1.6-1) be revised as follows:

(Note: proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

Amendment #1 -- Add a new second paragraph to Section I of AR II-1.6-1:

I. Introduction

The policies governing the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan are set forth in this administrative regulation. The University of Kentucky Board of Trustees has authorized three retirement plan carriers, effective July 1, 1988, to be utilized by University of Kentucky employees: Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association/College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA/CREF); Fidelity Institutional Services Company (Fidelity Investments); and Twentieth Century Investors, Inc. (Twentieth Century). It is the Board's intention that University employees be given a wide range of investment options during the years in which contributions are being made on the employees' behalf as well as a wide range of withdrawal options at the time of retirement. The term "retirement plan carrier", as used throughout this administrative regulation, includes all three retirement plan carriers that have been authorized by the Board of Trustees.

The policies governing insurance benefits for University retirees are a part of the Staff Personnel Policy and Procedure Administrative Regulations and are found in Numbers 91, 93, and 94. Information on these insurance programs is not included in this Administrative Regulation.

Background: This paragraph has been added for information and clarification.

Amendment #2 - Replace the entirety of existing Section III.A of AR II-1.6-1 with a new Section III.A:

(Explanatory note: All following material on this page plus that on pages 3, 4, and 5 is to be replaced with the new material on page 6.)

[III.A. Early Retirement

The University hereby establishes two types of early retirement. One type of early retirement (Section III.A.1) provides a qualified employee, who may be as young as 55, with an entitlement to early retirement without further contributions from the University toward the individual's retirement benefits, but with a modified University contribution toward the individual's health insurance coverage. The second type of early retirement (Section III.A.2) permits a qualified employee who will be at least 62 but less than 65 years of age in 1987-1988 or a subsequent fiscal year to apply by October 1 of the preceding year to be considered for early retirement with incentives of one or more additional University contributions toward the individual's retirement benefits and also the normal University contribution toward the individual's health insurance coverage to age 65 and a modified University contribution toward health insurance coverage thereafter.

1. Early Retirement Without Further University Contributions Toward Retirement Benefits, But With A Modified University Contribution Toward Health Insurance Coverage

Any employee aged at least 55 but less than 65, with a minimum of 15 years of regular service (whether or not continuous, including regular part-time service on a pro rata basis) and with a combination of age plus years of regular service equal to at least 75, upon request and prior administrative approval at least four months in advance, shall be permitted to retire from the University, after which the University shall make no further retirement contributions to the individual's retirement contracts. The early retiree, however, shall be eligible to participate in one of the health plans approved by the University and to receive a modified University contribution toward health insurance coverage which shall be equal to that provided for an individual retiring from the University at or above age 65.

Eligibility for early retirement under this section also shall apply, with administrative approval but without advance notice, to current employees who are in an inactive status as approved by the Board of Trustees.

a. Employee Approved For Early Retirement But Not Qualified For Supplemental Retirement Income

An employee who is approved for early retirement under Section III.A.1, and who is qualified for benefits under the Retirement Plan but not qualified for University supplemental retirement income, shall be permitted to retire with entitlement to all other University benefits and privileges available to those who retire at a normal or mandatory retirement date.

b. Employee Approved For Early Retirement and Qualified For Supplemental Retirement Income

An employee who is approved for early retirement under Section III.A.1, and who is qualified for benefits under the Retirement Plan and also for University supplemental retirement income starting at age 65, shall be permitted to retire with entitlement to all other University benefits and privileges available to those who retire at a normal or mandatory retirement date. The individual's supplemental retirement income, however, shall be subject to the following conditions:

(1) Payment of supplemental retirement income shall not begin until the month in which the early retiree attains age 65;

(2) Service credit for supplemental retirement income shall not accrue after the person retires;

(3) The salary used to determine supplemental retirement income shall be the basic annual salary for the last year of active employment;

(4) An early retiree who elects to proceed under this option shall not receive supplemental retirement benefits which exceed 20% of the basic annual salary received during the last year of active employment plus 1% of such salary for each year of active service to the University;

(5) The computation of supplemental retirement income will be based upon the assumptions in Section IV.B.6, except that the value of the single life annuity option is to be computed on the basis of the employee's age at the time early retirement commences; and

(6) Supplemental retirement benefits are not payable to survivors in the event the retiree dies prior to the attainment of age 65.

2. Early Retirement With Further University Contributions Toward Retirement Benefits and Health Insurance Coverage

Any employee who, within a particular fiscal year beginning with 1987-1988, will be at least 62 but less than 65 years of age and has a minimum of 20 years of regular service at the University of Kentucky (whether or not continuous, including regular part-time service on a pro rata basis), shall be permitted to apply by October 1 of the preceding fiscal year and be considered for early retirement starting on July 1 or other requested date in the applicable fiscal year. Eligibility to apply and be considered for early retirement under this section also extends to current employees who are in an inactive status as approved by the Board of Trustees. The dean or director of the college shall transmit the application for an employee applying for early retirement to the appropriate chancellor or, for an employee in the Central Administration, the Vice President for Administration. In the consideration of an application for early retirement from an employee in the Central Administration, the Vice President for Administration shall perform the same duties as those of a chancellor.

Chancellors shall base their decisions to grant early retirement on program considerations and the ability to fund the early retirement program. The standard criteria for qualifying for early retirement with further contributions by the University toward retirement benefits and health insurance coverage are as follows: (a) attainment of age 62 prior to the early retirement date and (b) regular employment at the University of Kentucky for twenty years or more. In the event that there are more applicants than the sector can permit in any year, selection of applicants shall be based on the sum of age and years of service with the higher number given priority. For example, 64 (age) + 20 (years of service) = 84 and 62 (age) + 35 (years of service) = 97, resulting in giving higher priority to the request of the applicant aged 62. In instances of major program changes or terminations or closures of University units, or other instances of extraordinary circumstances, the chancellor, with the approval of the President, may establish additional criteria for early retirement.

After confirming the age and service data for all applicants through the Office of Employee Benefits and Risk Management, the chancellor shall identify those persons who have applied for early retirement and meet the age, service, and any applicable additional criteria and shall recommend to the President the number of early retirements consistent with sector interest. The President shall transmit the names of the approved applicants to the Board of Trustees in the usual manner.

For an employee thus approved for early retirement, the University shall continue payment of the equivalent of retirement contributions (8% or 10% depending upon the individual's retirement group) to age 65. The employee shall be offered the choice of a lump sum payable either to the individual or to the individual's existing retirement contracts, or annual payments to age 65 either to the individual or to the individual's existing retirement contracts. If the scheduled payments are elected, a contract promising delivery at future dates certain shall be executed, thereby giving the individual's estate the right to payments.

Additionally, the individual approved for early retirement under this section shall be eligible to participate in one of the health plans approved by the University, and the University shall make a normal contribution to the individual's health insurance coverage to age 65 and a modified contribution toward the individual's health insurance coverage coordinated with Medicare beginning at age 65.

Employees not granted early retirement in a particular year shall be eligible to reapply in the next year assuming continued eligibility. To be considered for selection, employees must submit a new application each year.

a. Employee Approved For Early Retirement But Not Qualified For Supplemental Retirement Income

An employee who is approved for early retirement under Section III.A.2, and who is qualified for benefits under the Retirement Plan but not qualified for University supplemental retirement income, shall be permitted to retire with entitlement to all other University benefits and

privileges available to those who retire at a normal or mandatory retirement date.

b. Employee Approved for Early Retirement and Qualified for Supplemental Retirement Income

An employee who is approved for early retirement under Section III.A.2, and who is qualified for benefits under the Retirement Plan and also for University supplemental retirement income starting at age 65, shall be permitted to retire with entitlement to all other University benefits and privileges available to those who retire at a normal or mandatory retirement date. The individual's supplemental retirement income, however, shall be subject to the following conditions:

(1) Payment of supplemental retirement income shall not begin until the month in which the early retiree attains age 65;

(2) Service credit for supplemental retirement income shall not accrue after the person retires;

(3) The salary used to determine supplemental retirement income shall be the basic annual salary for the last year of active employment;

(4) An early retiree who elects to proceed under this option shall not receive supplemental retirement benefits which exceed 20% of the basic annual salary received during the last year of active employment plus 1% of such salary for each year of active service at the University;

(5) The computation of supplemental retirement income will be based upon the assumptions in Section IV.B.6, except that the value of the single life annuity option is to be computed on the basis of the employee's age at the time early retirement commences; and

(6) Supplemental retirement benefits are not payable to survivors in the event the retiree dies prior to the attainment of age 65.]

(Note: End of material to be deleted)

III.A. Retirement Prior to Age 65

Retirement prior to age 65 generally is considered as early retirement. Early retirement is authorized when the combination of the employee's age and years of regular full-time service (with a minimum of 15 years) equals or exceeds the number 75. Service needs not be continuous, and regular part-time service will be counted on a pro rata basis. Employees taking advantage of this early retirement must provide written notification through normal administrative channels to their appropriate chancellor or vice president at least three months in advance of the desired retirement date.

1. An employee who is taking early retirement and who is eligible for benefits as provided in Section IV.B shall be permitted to retire with entitlement to all University benefits except supplemental retirement income if applicable (as calculated under Section IV.B) at the time of retirement. Any supplemental retirement income is subject to the following conditions:

(a) Payment of supplemental retirement income shall not begin until the month in which the early retiree attains age 65;

(b) Service credit for supplemental retirement income shall not accrue after the person retires;

(c) The salary used to determine supplemental retirement income shall be the basic annual salary for the last year of active employment;

(d) An early retiree who elects to proceed under this option shall not receive supplemental retirement benefits which exceed 20% of the basic annual salary received during the last year of active employment plus 1% of such salary for each year of active service to the University;

(e) The computation of supplemental retirement income will be based upon the assumptions in Section IV.B.6, except that the value of the single life annuity option is to be computed on the basis of the employee's age at the time early retirement commences; and

(f) Supplemental retirement benefits are not payable to survivors in the event the retiree dies prior to the attainment of age 65.

2. An employee who is taking early retirement but is not eligible for benefits as provided for in Section IV.B shall be permitted to retire with entitlement to all other University benefits.

3. An employee retiring under Section III.A shall receive payment in lump sum of the equivalent of the employer retirement contributions for the number of months the retirement precedes age 65 not to exceed a total of 36 months regardless of the age of the employee at the time of retirement.

Background: The University of Kentucky amended its retirement plan in 1986 offering two opportunities for retirement in advance of age 65. This amendment will provide enhanced opportunities for retirement in advance of age 65 to a larger number of long-term employees and provide greater personnel cost management flexibility to the University's administration.

This revised policy will provide early retirement opportunities to about 600 employees who have a combination of age and years of service which equal 75 or more. Many of these employees are not eligible for early retirement under the present policy.

Employees retiring under this revised provision shall: receive payment in lump sum of the equivalent of the employer retirement contributions for the number of months the retirement precedes age 65, not to exceed a total of 36 months regardless of the age of the employee at the time of retirement; continue to receive a University contribution toward the cost of health insurance; have the opportunity to activate their funded benefits based on their own schedule; and receive entitlements under the old University unfunded plan at age 65 if they are eligible.

There has been considerable interest in the existing University early retirement provisions. More than half of the retirements that are now occurring involve people that are not age 65. The purpose of this retirement change is to simplify and enhance the existing early retirement provisions into a single early retirement policy.

This revised policy will provide an alternative retirement option to long-term employees of the University which is somewhat similar to those provided for employees of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Federal Government.

As with the current retirement policy, the costs associated with this revised policy will be funded through the management of the existing personnel budgets of the institution.

INCENTIVE RETIREMENT PLAN

Recommendation: that a one time Incentive Retirement Plan be offered to regular full time active employees who were age 65 or older and had a minimum of 15 years of full time service as of August 21, 1990. Service though it need not be continuous, must be as a result of a regular appointment at the University of Kentucky.

Retirements under this plan must be scheduled to occur on or before December 31, 1990. However, employees taking advantage of this plan must make a written election through appropriate administrative channels no later than 30 days prior to the intended retirement date giving notice of their intention to participate and establishing their retirement date. The employee's assignment on August 21, 1990 will determine faculty or staff status for incentive early retirement purposes.

Two incentives will be applicable for retirements under this offering:

- 1.a. FACULTY - the University will pay to the individual faculty member in lump sum the monthly employer retirement payment, based on the 1990-91 annual salary (for College of Medicine Clinical Faculty based on their 90-91 tenure base salary commitment) for each month the retirement precedes the end of the fiscal year in which the faculty member attains the mandatory retirement age of 70, not to exceed a total of 60 months.
- 1.b. STAFF - the University will pay to the individual staff member in lump sum the monthly employer retirement payment, based on the 1990-91 annual salary for each month the retirement precedes the age 73 birth month not to exceed a total of 60 months.
2. FACULTY AND STAFF - the University will also pay to the individual in lump sum an amount not to exceed \$25,000 based on years of full time service according to the following schedule:

<u>YEARS OF FULL TIME SERVICE AS OF AUGUST 21, 1990</u>	<u>% of 1990-91 SALARY (or Tenure Base Salary)</u>
15 but less than 20 years	25%
20 but less than 25 years	30%
25 but less than 30 years	35%
30 but less than 35 years	40%
35 but less than 40 years	45%
40 or more years	50%

Background: The University of Kentucky is offering this one-time window of opportunity Incentive Retirement Plan for faculty and staff to create some long-term program and financial flexibility.

Employees taking advantage of this one-time window of opportunity Incentive Retirement Plan will be able to significantly enhance their own retirement program.

The Plan will afford the institution some additional flexibility in reaching institutional salary objectives and dealing with shifting program and resource needs.

All costs of the Incentive Retirement Plan will be funded from existing positions within the University budget.

Background: At its December 1989 meeting, the Board of Trustees approved a restructuring of Academic Affairs, Lexington Campus, that included the creation of the position of Dean of Undergraduate Studies. He chaired the General Education Review Committee from 1984 to 1986, which led to the establishment of the University Studies Program.

Dr. Swift is well respected at the University of Kentucky for his support for and expertise in undergraduate education and teaching. The University is fortunate to have in its ranks a person so well qualified as Professor Swift to provide leadership in this important area.

Background: Dr. W.P. Garrigus joined the Department of Animal Sciences faculty in 1937 and served as chairman from 1941 until his retirement in 1974. From 1951 to 1962, he also served as associate director of the Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station. Under his leadership the department grew from a small faculty that dealt mostly with undergraduate teaching and extension to a world-renowned research and graduate teaching department with expanded undergraduate teaching and extension functions. In addition to being a teacher and researcher, Dr. Garrigus was an excellent recruiter, an outstanding administrator, and a dedicated and loyal University of Kentucky faculty member who sought constantly to improve the department, the College of Agriculture, and the University. He also was committed to improving Kentucky agriculture by insuring that knowledge developed through research was made rapidly available through the extension service to producers, farmers, and other agriculturally related groups.

Dr. Garrigus was honored many times by state, regional, and national organizations. It is only fitting that he be further recognized by having a research and education facility for which he worked diligently and was proud to occupy named in his honor.

In accordance with University Policy, the Committee for Naming University Buildings has made its recommendation to the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus who recommends to the President and Board of Trustees that the Agricultural Science Building--South be named the GARRIGUS BUILDING.

- (3) Two (2) Kentucky Tobacco Research Board representatives elected by and from the Kentucky Tobacco Research Board membership; these persons should be elected from Kentucky Tobacco Research Board constituencies not represented by the Chairperson.
- (4) Vice President for Research and Graduate Studies of the University of Kentucky.
- (5) Two (2) University representatives appointed by the President of the University of Kentucky.
- (6) Three (3) public representatives appointed by the President of the University of Kentucky upon recommendation by the Kentucky Tobacco Research Board.

Each member of the Board, except for the ex-officio members, shall be appointed for one (1) term of four (4) years. The members may succeed themselves for staggered terms of one (1) to four (4) years, as determined by the President, but the members except for those serving ex-officio may not serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
