A smaller group, the Kentucky Library Association, is holding its 1985 annual meeting at the Executive Inn Riverfront & Convention Center in Paducah. Sample programs include "What does the future hold for libraries and librarians in the information Age," "Issues and trends for school librarians," and the intriguing, "Do I have to be in my right mind to be a librarian?"
