The faculty met in special session at the call of the President at 12:20 in the President's office. Those present were President Patterson, Professors White, Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Wilson, Noe, Zembrod, Maxson and Hooper.

The President read a communication from a committee of the Junior class as follows:-

President and Faculty of the State University of Kentucky.
Gentlemen:-

As a committee appointed by the male members of the Junior class of this institution, we respectfully request that the order, recently issued, which requires our class to drill, be countermanded. Our reasons for this request are briefly as follows:-

1. Our class has drilled as faithfully and as long as any class in this institution for many years past.
2. The military instruction given in this institution, optional to Juniors and Seniors, has been and now is entirely satisfactory to the War Department of the United States Government.
3. The schedule of work adopted last spring does not require, and makes no provision for, military duties for either Juniors or Seniors and the approval of this schedule by the Trustees of this University subsequent to their order requiring military services of Juniors nullifies and sets aside their former order.

After considerable informal discussion of this communication, it was moved by Professor Wilson, seconded by Professor Frankel, that the communication be transmitted to the ^{Executive Committee of the} Board of Trustees with the approval of the faculty. Professor Miller moved as an amendment, which was accepted by the original mover, that it be recommended, pending the decision of the ^{Faculty} ~~Executive Committee~~, that the ~~Executive~~ ^{Faculty} ~~Committee~~ suspend the enforcement of the order. The motion, as thus amended, was carried and the meeting adjourned.
