



Drug center at UK worthwhile venture for this University

The announcement by UK officials on Friday that the University has received a \$2.75 million grant for drug abuse research should make this institution a leader in an important field that we are just beginning to understand. The five-year grant from the National Institute on Drug Abuse will establish a Drug Abuse Prevention Research Center at UK. Research will focus on identifying the causes of drug and alcohol abuse and methods to correct these problems.

Drug abuse is pervasive throughout society. There is a wealth of information about the biological causes and effects of drug abuse, yet research about the psychological and sociological aspects of drug abuse is relatively new. The center's research will be a multidisciplinary effort — a 50-cent word for saying that drug abuse research a large and complex problem.

This center will, for the first time, bring together biological, genetic and "psycho-social" approaches to drug abuse-related issues by looking at drug abuse from different angles.

From studying what our elementary schools do to educate students about the perils of drug abuse to a study of the effectiveness of the anti-drug advertisements we see on TV, the UK center will look at drug abuse in a comprehensive way that it hasn't been examined before.

We applaud the members of UK's faculty who met rigorous standards for landing the grant for the University. The center will bring UK a great deal of added respect in the academic community, which is undoubtedly important to the life and reputation of any academic institution.

More importantly, however, the addition of the center shows a willingness on the part of the faculty at this University to address a problem that affects every element of society, but in even larger numbers among college-age people.


