Elevators set to get million dollar fix-up

Has an elevator in Kirwan or Blanding towers ever felt more like a roller coaster at King's Island, a bit too bouncy and a little too shaky? If so, help is on the way. The University expects to receive bids on a \$1.1 million renovation of the six elevators in March and work should begin in early July with completion slated for January of 1998.

The faint of heart can rest assured that the elevators are safe until then. The renovations are not a reaction to safety problems but simply an effort to bring the elevators into the '90s and meter equirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, said Allen Rieman, director of Auxillary Services.

vices. Those elevators were originally installed in 1967, so they are 30 years old, said Rieman, who oversees Housing and Food Services. "It is a complete overhaul of everything except for the car(s) itself," which have been replaced over the past five

Plete memory of the functions performed by relay switches in the elevator system. Previously these witches were difficult and expensive to replace because they are no longer manufactured. Any replacements had to be hand-built for the University.

The microprocessors will also create the most noticeable improvement. The elevator cars will start more quickly and come to a softer landing on floors without the bounce students now feel as the cars level themselves with the floor.

The new equipment should eliminate glitches, which have sometimes prevented cars from stopping at a chosen floor, Rieman said.

Hundreds of sleep-deprived students should also be pleased with the addition of new fire detection equipment in the shafts and lobbies. The equipment should reduce the number of false alarms that have forced students to evacuate the building in the early morning hours, Rieman explained.

Something that students might not notice is an air conditioning unit to be installed in the tower penthouses. These units will prolong the life of new machinery by keeping it cool and hopefully lessen future repair costs.

The renovation will proceed in roughly three two-month phases so that at least two elevators are always in operation in each tower. This should minimize the wait time that students would have encountered if the renovations were done all at once.

He is well known for his free-throw routine, during which he would wipe his hands on his socks while at the foul line. It must have helped: Macy is the leading free-throw shouter in school history and the Southeastern Conference for a season (91.2 percent) and career (89 percent).
Macy is a leading candidate for the position of head basketball coach at Morehead State.

Despite losing four players from last year, plus Derek Anderson to injury and Jeff Sheppard to redshirt, Epps has been a steady force for the Cats in pursuit of a second consecutive national championship.

Goach Rick Pitino said in January that everybody would need to increase their play by 20 percent to make up for Anderson's

Epps and the Cats have a long way to go to reach the level they had achieved at this point last season, especially with three road trips coming up at Alabama, Vanderbilt and Tennessee.

"This season has been very challenging, overcoming all the

obstacles. Our team has stayed focused, and we just need to keep it up."

Another obstacle people sometimes forget is the pressure the players and the team have on them to bring home another championship.

"In this town there's a lot of expectations," Epps said. "It just motivates us that much more. We have to play that much harder."

In overcoming that pressure, Epps has been something of an unsung hero for the Cats. His winning attitude has taken this team to great places in his four years at UK.

"Anthony Epps is a winner. Period," Pitino said earlier this season. "Next to the definition of winner in Webster's Dictionary should be Anthony's picture."




