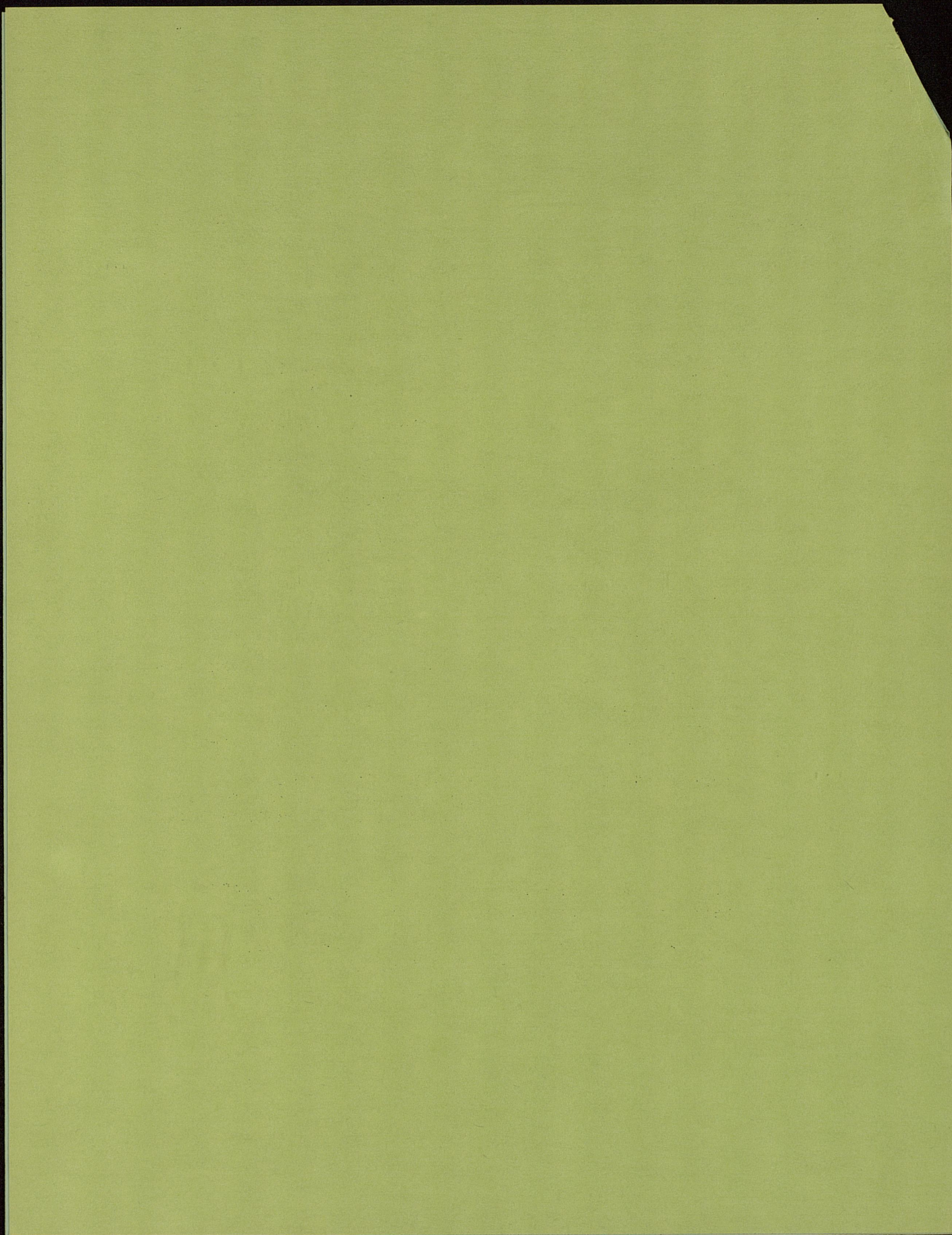

## Fine Policy Revision Clarification

Entry number 3 in the "Senate Library Committee Annual Report" ("Green Bean" no. 457, p.3) may have caused some confusion concerning the fine policy. To clarify, library system's books can be recalled if needed after the initial two weeks of the check-out period. Fines of \$1.00 a day will begin one week after a recall notice has been sent (up to a \$20.00 maximum). Fines for overdue books that have not been recalled will remain 25 cents/day. Implementation of the new fine policy is being planned for the fall.
