



Know all men by these presents, that we, S. M. Yost, Jacob Yost, David E. Strasburg and H. C. Linsley, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Virginia in the just and full sum of two thousand, one hundred and twenty-three dollars and sixty cents (\$2123.60), to which payment, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves jointly and severally, our joint and several heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents, Sealed with our seals and dated this July 1, 1878.

The conditions of the above obligation is such that, whereas by an act of the General Assembly of Virginia entitled "an act prescribing the manner in which Records for the Supreme Court of Appeals shall be printed, and providing for letting the same to contract," approved April 30, 1874, it is, among other things, provided, "that the Clerks of the Supreme Court of Appeals at Richmond, Staunton, Winchester and Martinsville, shall in the month of June, in the year 1874, and annually thereafter, in the same month, solicit proposals by advertising in some newspaper published in their respective localities, for the printing for one year of such records of Courts as may be required, under existing laws to be printed for the use of the Supreme Court of Appeals, in determining appeals;" and whereas the Clerk of said Court at Staunton (which includes Win-

chester) has advertised for such proposals as re-
quired; and S. M. Yost and Jacob Yost, partners trad-
ing under the name and style of S. M. Yost & Son,
having in writing proposed to print all such records
of Courts as may be required for the use of the Su-
preme Court of Appeals at Staunton, under the di-
rection and superintendence of the Clerk of said
Court, for one year, commencing on July 1st 1878, and
ending on June 30th 1879, inclusive, on the fol-
lowing terms, to wit: "We will furnish suitable
" paper, do the printing and binding, furnish a neat
" cover with the style of the case and the Court press
" which it covers and the number of the record printed
" neatly thereon, the printing to be done in small
" pica type, and each page to contain 1500 ems
" by measure, whether the work be plain, figure or
" rule, at the price of one dollar and fifteen
" cents (\$ 1.15) per page, including the cover, which
" is to be counted as one page, and twelve (12)
" printed copies, or such number as the Court may
" require of each record"; and the said S. M. Yost
& Son being, in the opinion of the Clerk, the lowest
responsible bidders proposing to do the work at
Staunton, under the supervision of the Clerk as re-
quired, and the contract for same for the year a-
foresaid having been awarded to them: Now, there-
fore, if the said S. M. Yost & Son shall print
all such records of Courts as may be required for

the use of the Supreme Court of Appeals at Staunton, including Winchester, for one year commencing the 1st day of July, 1875, and ending the 30th day of June, 1879, inclusive, furnish suitable paper, do the printing and binding, furnish a neat cover with the style of the case and the Court from which it comes and the number of the record printed neatly thereon, the printing to be done in small pica type and each page to contain 1500 lines by measure, whether the work be plain, figure or rule, at the price of one dollar and fifteen cents (\$1.15) per page, including the cover which is to be counted as one page, and shall execute the work promptly under the direction and supervision of the Clerk, and shall deliver to the Clerk twelve printed copies, or such number as the Court may require, as provided by law, then the above obligation to be void and of no effect; otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
