Respected Mentor Awarded Rookie Contract

POR THE PAST several weeks students, alumni, and all interested in the welfare of the University anxiously have been awaiting Coach Adolph Rupp's decision in the matter of the one-year contract offered him. Today they may again rest content. Thank you, Coach Rupp, for signing your contract and showing your loyalty to the University.

Notwithstanding the fact that Coach Rupp signed his contract. The Kernel sincerely feels that in offering this bort-termed agreement to a coach who has consistently proven his ability to produce superior teams, the Athletic Council has issued an unwarranted rebuse.

The Athletic Council was established to supervise athletics at this University. It was to represent the students and alumni, and in its function it was to reflect their opinions. The Kernel feels that in issuing this apparent lack of confidence, it was voicing the opinion of neither testudents nor the alumni.

It has been mentioned that Coach Rupp's contract was written for but a year because of the new ruling which goes into effect this year, and which requires such action. This ruling may be advantageous in the selection of assistant coaches, but in the appraisal of coaches of major sports, it is not justifiable. Basketball at this University receives far wider acclaim than any other sport. It is as equally a major sport as football.

The football coach is allowed more than one year in which to develop his team. Should not the basketball coach be given an equal opportunity — moreover since he has proven his ability to produce superior teams?

This move on the part of the Council has made it evident that it, like several other organizations on this campus, must be reformed. Their present action has disclosed that, though theoretically students and alumni are members of the Council, neither are properly represented, and nor the alumnus is directly allowed to suggest expenditure of this money. It is, simply, "taxation without representation."

Because of the present situation, caused by the provision in the Athletic Association constitution calling for the appointment of Council members, is proving unsatisfactory, The Kernel strongly suggests that in the future, undergraduates and alumni members be allowed to select their own representatives to the Athletic Council.

Considerable has been the comment erupted by an editorial printed in the Friday edition of

The Kernel in which was presented a reportorial revue of the commercialization of college graduates by the use of publications which praise every mentionable merit of each finished classroom product.

In that editorial The Kernel did not deplore the sheepskin ledger; it merely insinuated that graduate handbooks indicate the "abandonment of academic dignity."

The bachelor and master degrees of today do

The bachelor and master degrees of today do not command the same respect that those degrees were entitled to ten years ago. The bachelor of arts or science tag is now accepted as part of every person's make-up. The letters do not inspire employment directors to seize a man bearing an educational title. Then years ago a college man was immediately rushed into a position of consequence; nowadays a college man is just another applicant.

On top of the overflow of graduates, crashed the depression, bringing with it bankruptcy and an unemployment situation never before equalled. And still twice a year, though skilled labor trudged the streets vainly searching for a way to earn a dollar, universities pumped into the world regiments of eager young men specialized in fields that could not absorb them.

In desperation, seniors attempted to alleviate this plight by mailing publicity pamphlets which explained to employment chiefs the availability of trained new blood. In many cases these notices won men jobs; hence, the understaing has been justified. Far be it from this newspaper to cavil with any medium that gets men jobs.

Investigation shows that the graduating students, each pool a certain amount, and direct it toward the cost of editing and printing the book. The only requirement for a man to attain recognition in the index is the payment of the entry fee. And, of course, everyone pays it. The book is published under the supervision of a faculty member and it bears the name of the college.

of all of its graduates; that each one is the answer to a foreman's prayer. In reality, the college does not approve of all of its graduates and
it would not recommend everyone if the selection system were more strict. The law of avertion system were more strict. The law of averages will rule that some of the entries are incompetent. Should an incompetent be hired on the grace of his photo and the conviction of his biography, then the college is in for a rap when the man fails. In this way the reputation of the college may be unjustly damaged.

Lastly, the mortar board sale is evidence of the strengthening menace that a college man is schooled solely in technicalities rather than in a comprehensive curriculum. Under the pres-

a comprehensive curriculum. Under the present set-up culture is becoming of infinitesimal importance. Today many universities are clubs of vocational colleges, each independent of the

other.

The Kernel wishes to make it understood that it does not oppose these personnel publications as long as the publicized ones obtain jobs. What The Kernel wishes to make known is that such publications, along with all the other snappy-attention-getting devices, are tending to speed
