


Are you in favor of increasing the Assessment 25 cents per member, to be used for maintaining the Old Masons' Home?

Believing that there is need on the part of each of the above named organizations for suitable gnarters, exactly adapted & their individual purposes, and Knowing that there is not at the present time a first class building of any description in the city of Sepington, and having in mind the fact that in unity there is strength, the undereigned begs leave to present for your consideration a plan, whereby with the so-operation of each of the above. named organizations, and the in dividual members thereof a sufficient sum may be raised to wherewith & erect a mammoth building that shall accommode their all. Our conception of such a building is that it shall be of sufficient size upon the ground floor, eary rotect by 160 feel, with a central leour 30x40 feel, with three or four handsome stores

The balance of the second story to about 20 first class offices. about will be arranged fine large lødge roome, about 50x70 fut in size, with auto-rooms, reception rooms, waiting rooms, reading rooms, libraries, etc etc, each t be arranged for the accommodation of the individual ander or elut that is & have role use and possession, and the so arranged that each order shall have its apartments entirely reparated from any other. This would require an eight or mine story building, to be built of steel, stone + terra cotta, entirely fireproof, with express elevators, and would be a modern, first-class, metropoletan building, a monument & the enterprise of the members of the orders and the citizens of Sexuation, and would do more toward the upbulding of our organizations and the lity of Sex ington thear sould possibly result from the came amount effected on a half dogen separate buildings.

We would suggest that such a building be dalled The Fraternal Building - It would sost with the land, complete, not less than one hundred and fifty thousand (#150.00), and sould be raised on the principle of the Building associans. Let there he organized a stock company, with capital of 150,000, of 1500 shares of 100 each, payable at 1 per month for 100 months or 8/3 years, Let every member organization susscribe for a certain amount of the stock, and every individual member take one or more shares. Let the company be governed by a board of directors. consisting of one elected at large from by each organization represented, and one for every one hundred, as fraction of one hundred shares represented by members of each organization. at the end of the first year the ground could be purchased, and at the sind of the second year the building could be erected, and bouded for 6 years, at which time all the shares would have malured and the debt faid off, the morne from the building in the mean time toling care of the interest. To Kentucky Lodges, F. and A. M .: -

DEAR BRETHREN—At the annual communication of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, held October 15-17, 1901, the following was adopted:

"Be it resolved, That the subordinate lodges of this jurisdiction be, and the same are hereby requested by this Grand Lodge, to adopt a resolution appointing the Grand Master, as their proxy, to vote their respective life memberships in the Masonic Widows and Orphans' Home and Infirmary, in the election of Directors of said Masonic Widows and Orphans' Home and Infirmary;

"That it shall be the duty of the Grand Secretary to formulate a power of attorney or proxy for the use of Lodges and request them to comply with the foregoing resolution by signing said power of attorney or letter of proxy for the purpose aforesaid"

In obedience to this edict of the Grand Lodge, I have formulated a proxy which is herewith inclosed, that you may comply with the request of the Grand Lodge, if such is your desire, and which I request you to do, as the Grand Lodge directed me.

Kindly fill the blanks, have it signed by the Worshipful Master and attested by the Secretary, with Lodge Seal, then detach it and return it to me as soon as convenient, as the election will take place at an early day.

First, it is desirable to this Lodge because it is believed that it will greatly increase and revive an interest in Masonry in this section of the State; and it will be desirable to this Community it.

Secondly, the advantages to the Home will be the central location at Lexington, its easy access by excellent railread connections from every part of the State, its location in a quiet, orderly and thrifty community, in the very heart of the richest agricultural region of the State, and where its immates will be subject to the wholesome influence of a surrounding population of culture and intelligence.


