Democrats, led by Sen. Edward Kennedy of Massachusetts and Rep. George Miller of California, cite an expected \$11.3 billion shortfall in state education budgets in fiscal year 2002. Congressional negotiators are working to reconcile differences in education bills approved by the House and the Senate.

CAMARILLO Calif. — The price of gasoline fell 4.5 cents in the past two weeks because of weak demand and the plunging cost of crude oil, industry analyst Trilby Lundberg said Sunday. Some regions of the country are seeing buckagalion gas for the first time in months, Lundberg said. The lowest price in the nation Friday for a gallon of regular grade was 97 cents in Atlanta, and the highest was \$18.2 in Honolulu The price of gasoline has fallen 32.2 cents since Sept. 7, shortly before the terrorist attacks that further slowed the nation's economy.

### 8 accused of aiding terrorist attacks

8 accused of aiding terrorist attacks MADRID. Spain — A Spanish magistrate accused eight men of involvement in the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks on the United States on Sunday, ordering them jailed and charging them with belonging to Osama bin Laden's al-Qaida network. The suspects 'were directly linked to the preparation and carrying out of the attacks perpetrated by 'suicide pilots' on Sept. 11, 2001, 'Judge Baltasar Garzon said in his jailling order. Garzon, an investigative judge, formally charged the men with membership in a terrorist organization — al-Qaida — and with document falsification, robbery and weapons possession. He accused them of "as many terrorism crimes as there were victims on Sept. 11. "The men denied the charges, which Garzon said were based on evidence from telephone conversations of the group's alleged leader — Inmad Eddin Barakat Yarkas, whose alias is Abu Dahdah — before and after the attacks. The judge did not provide any details of the evidence.

### Taliban offers surrender, conditionally

Taliban offers surrender, conditionally BANGI, Afghanistan — The Taliban offered on Sunday to surrender their last northern stronghold if Arab and other foreign fighters loyal to Osama bin Laden in the city are spared, an anti-Taliban commander said. The offer to surrender Kunduz came after U.S. bombers unleashed their heaviest strikes so far on the city. In Washington, National Security Adviser Condoleezza Rice said the advances on the ground were reducing bin Laden's room to maneuver. 'We think that the more that we are stripping away his protection ... that we're beginning to narrow his possibilities for hiding," Rice told CNN's "Late Edition."

The best viewing in the United States was between 4 and 6 am EST, but people on the East Coast reported seeing meteors fly even after dawn broke at 6:46. Some meteors could be seen even in New York City, where light pollution normally makes for poor skygazing, Phillips said.

The Leonid shower occurs each. November, when the Earth's orbit takes it through the trail of particles shed by the Comet Tempel-Tuttle as it swings around the sun once every 33 years. Most particles are smaller than a grain of rice. They travel 45 miles a second and burn up in brilliant streaks of light. The meteors are called Leonids because they appear to come from the direction of the constellation Leo.



# Right to medicine could extend to all

Should we rob the rich to save the poor?

Should we rob the rich to save the poor?

In the wake of the recent anthrax scares, Canada demanded that Bayer, a German drug company that manufactures the super-antibiotic Cipro that is used to treat anthrax, allow a Canadian company to make a generic version of the same drug.

Of course, they adamantly resisted because the generic version would be much cheaper, and Bayer would reap none of the benefits. The United States determined that the anthrax crises were a "public health emergency" and, with that justification, demanded that Bayer relinquish its patent rights on the drug.

There is a great irony here.
Poor countries — most notably Brazil, Grenada, Haiti and those of sub-Saharan Africa — have been beating on the intellectual property door for years. They want AIDS drugs, and they want them cheap. In the United States, the HIV "cocktail" of pills runs the average patient \$10,000 monthly; in the developing world, where entire villages might not earn \$10,000 annually, such costs are too astronomical to even dream of meeting. Consequently, poor countries ask that in the midst of their public health emergencies, Western drug manufacturers release generic drugs or sell patented products at dramatically lower prices. Guess who stands primarily in their way?

That's right, the good old United States; America has long been the bastion of international intellectual property rights. The government claims, and rightly so, that such benevolence on the part of drug companies would cause huge profit losses, perhaps even impairing research on other drugs or vaccines.

It's a sticky issue.

But can we honestly say that 12 sick Americans, four of them dead, are more of a "public health emergency" than 30 million dead and dying Africans?

### **Punishments** fit fraternities' indiscretions

Soon after pictures of racially offensive cos-tumes at fraternity parties found their way onto the Internet, national fraternity leaders and university administrators moved to punish the

offending groups.

Auburn University's Delta Sigma Phi and Beta Theta Pi chapters were closed by the fraternities' national boards of directors this week. Both national boards expressed regret for what

Both national boards expressed regret for what happened last month, emphasizing that the images of students in Klan robes and blackface, made famous last week, do not reflect the values of the organizations.

At the University of Mississippi, Alpha Tau Omega was suspended for a year by the school in the wake of a party where a fraternity member was photographed in a police uniform, pointing a gun at a member in blackface. Every officer of the chapter has resigned, and the fraternity's alumni will run the chapter during the suspension.

Ole Miss's ATO chapter was fortunate, in a way; the furor surrounding Auburn's Halloween parties almost overshadowed identical insensi-tivity on its part. The chapter should be thankful it was not dealt the same fate as Auburn's frater-

ntities. ATO, though on suspension, will be able to resume normal operations in November 2002. The same cannot be said for Beta Theta Pi and Delta Sigma Phi, though. While it is unfortunate that many students who had no direct involvement with the incidents are now forced to either look for a new fraternity or become indeeither look for a new fraternity or become inde-pendents, we feel that both fraternities' national directors were justified in disbanding the chapters.

Some have argued that the punishment is Some nave argued that the punishment is excessive because the Klan robes and blackface pictured represent the poor taste of a few, not the views of the fraternity as a whole. But every organization is held accountable for the actions of its members. For example, what the news writers of The Crimson White put in the news reflects, not only not the written them. paper reflects not only on the writers them

Similarly, fraternities have a responsibility to make sure their members do not display images that threaten and mock other groups of students. 



Students will be among millions of shoppers paying cash or charging their credit cards Friday "Black Friday" to those of you rushing to the mall to buy gifts as the holiday shopping season starts.

The National Retail Federa-

tion's 2001 Consumer Holiday Outlook survey shows an aver-age of \$940 per household will be spent this holiday season on gifts for family and friends
