Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 8, 1987.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 9 a.m. Lexington time on Tuesday, December 8, 1987 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

A. Meeting Opened

Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m., and the invocation was pronounced by Mr. Ted Bates.

B. Roll Call

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. Robert T. McCowan (Chairman), Mr. Ted B. Bates, Professor Raymond F. Betts, Professor Mary Sue Coleman, Professor David R. Driscoll, Jr., Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. Lawrence E. Forgy, Jr., Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mr. Henry E. Hershey, Senator Walter D. Huddleston, Mr. T. A. Lassetter, Dr. Nicholas J. Pisacano, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Jr., Mr. James L. Rose, Mr. Jerome A. Stricker, Judge Julia K. Tackett, Mr. Bobby Watson, Ms. Cyndi Weaver, and Mr. Billy B. Wilcoxson. Absent from the meeting were Governor Albert B. Chandler, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. George W. Griffin, Jr., and Mr. R. Larry Jones. The University administration was represented by President David P. Roselle; Mr. Edward A. Carter, Vice President for Administration; Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth, Art Gallaher and Charles T. Wethington; Dr. Raymond R. Hornback, Vice President for University Relations; Mr. Eugene R. Williams, Acting Vice President for Information Systems; Mr. John C. Darsie, Legal Counsel.

Members of the news media were also in attendance. Mrs. Hayes reported a quorum present, and Mr. McCowan declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 9:06 a.m.

C. Minutes Approved

On motion made by Mr. Ramsey, seconded by Mr. Watson and passed, the Minutes of the October 20, 1987 meeting of the Board of Trustees were approved as written.

D. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

In order to lessen the time of the meeting and thus permit Board members to attend the inauguration of Governor Wallace Wilkinson in Frankfort, President Roselle did not review the items in his "Report to the Trustees," copies of which were distributed earlier. He suggested that the Trustees might wish to read it at a later date and recommended that the report be accepted. Without objection, it was so ordered.

E. Presentation of Plaques

President Roselle indicated his pleasure in presenting Dr. William Markesbery with plaques for the Commonwealth Center of Excellence in Aging and the Endowed Chair in Aging, and Dr. John Connolly with the plaque for the Commonwealth Center of Excellence in Computational Science.

Dr. Markesbery indicated his pleasure in receiving the plaques on behalf of the Sanders-Brown Center on Aging and stated that the Center of Excellence is to establish a new and unique program in the area of strokes for Kentuckians. He was then given a round of applause.

Dr. Connolly expressed his gratefulness to the Council on Higher Education and the University for its strong support, following which he was also given a round of applause.

F. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

After noting that the personnel actions in PR 2 were routine in nature, President Roselle recommended its approval. Without discussion, on motion made by Professor Coleman, seconded by Mr. Hershey, and passed, the appointments and staff changes recommended in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3A-1)

Acting on the recommendation of President Roselle, Mr. Hershey moved approval of the supplemental personnel action in PR 3A-1. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and carried. (See PR 3A-1 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Report on Results of Alumni Member Election (PR 3A-2)

President Roselle stated that the term of Mr. Frank Ramsey, Jr., an alumnus member of the Board, expires December 31, 1987, and asked Mrs. Hayes, Secretary of the Board of Trustees, to report the results of the election to the Board.

Mrs. Hayes reported that the three persons receiving the highest number of votes in the election for an alumni member of the Board of Trustees were Frank Ramsey, Jr., $Doris\ Smith\ Henton$, and $Henry\ R.\ Wilhoit$, Jr.

Mr. Bates moved that the report of the Secretary of the Board of Trustees be received and put to record, and that she be authorized to certify to the Governor the names of the three persons receiving the largest number of votes, from which list a successor to Mr. Frank Ramsey will be appointed. The motion was seconded by Mr. Wilcoxson and passed without dissent. (See PR 3A-2 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. 1987-88 Budget Revisions (PR 3B)

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the budget revisions as recommended in PR 3B were authorized and approved. (See PR 3B at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Candidates for Pegrees - Community College System (PR 4A)

Without discussion, Mrs. Hayes moved that the degrees specified in PR 4A be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees have been satisfactorily completed. Her motion was seconded by Mr. Stricker and carried. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Candidates for Degrees - Lexington Campus and Medical Center (PR 5A)

Mr. Stricker moved that President Roselle be authorized to confer upon each individual whose name was listed in PR 5A the correct degree to which he or she is entitled upon certification by the University Registrar that the individual has satisfactorily completed all requirements for the degree. His motion was seconded by Dr. Pisacano and passed unanimously. (See PR 5A at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Turner Professorship in Marketing (PR 5B)

President Roselle indicated his pleasure in recommending that the Board establish in the Department of Marketing, College of Business and Economics, the Turner Professorship in Marketing. The motion, which was made by Professor Coleman and seconded by Mr. Ramsey, was voted on and unanimously carried. (See PR 5B at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Garvice D. Kincaid Professorship (PR 5C)

President Roselle also indicated his pleasure in recommending that the Board establish in the College of Business and Economics the Garvice D. Kincaid Professorship. Mr. Forgy so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Farmer and passed without dissent. (See PR 5C at the end of the Minutes.)

N. <u>Naming of University Building (PR 5D)</u>

With President Roselle so recommending, Dr. Pisacano moved that the Board approve the name THOMAS D. CLARK BUILDING for the building located at 663 South Limestone Street which houses the University of Kentucky Press. The motion, seconded by Mr. Stricker carried. (See PR 5D at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Naming of University Building (PR 5E)

On motion made by Judge Tackett, seconded by Mr. Watson and passed, the Board of Trustees approved the name BRUCE POUNDSTONE REGULATORY SERVICES BUILDING for the new Regulatory Services Building under construction. (See PR 5E at the end of the Minutes.)

P. <u>Doctor of Philosophy Degree Program in Public</u> Administration (PR 5F)

President Roselle recommended that the Board approve for submission to the Council on Higher Education a new Doctor of Philosophy degree program in Public Administration. Mrs. Hayes so moved. Her motion was seconded by Mr. Stricker and passed without dissent. (See PR 5F at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. <u>Bachelor of Arts Pegree Program in Arts Administration (PR</u>

On motion made by Mr. Ramsey, seconded by Professor Coleman and carried, the Board approved for submission to the Council on Higher Education a new Bachelor of Arts degree program in Arts Administration. (See PR 5G at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Patent Assignments (PR 6A)

With President Roselle so recommending, Senator Huddleston moved that the routine patent assignments in PR 6A be accepted. His motion was seconded by Dr. Pisacano and passed unanimously. (See PR 6A at the end of the Minutes.)

S. Fund Board of Directors Appointments (PR 6B)

President Roselle recommended that approval be given to the reappointment of Arch Mainous, Jr. and the appointment of Ted Hahn as members of the Board of THE FUND for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center. Mr. Hershey so moved; his motion was seconded by Mr. Bates and carried. (See PR 6B at the end of the Minutes.)

T. Proposed Amendments to the Health Sciences Student Professional Behavior Code (PR 6C)

Dr. Pisacano moved, and Professor Coleman seconded, that the proposed amendments to the Health Sciences Student Professional Behavior Code in PR 6C be approved. The motion carried unanimously. (See PR 6C at the end of the Minutes.)

U. Recognition of Mr. Robert McCowan's Reappointment to the Board of Trustees

Mr. Forgy congratulated Mr. McCowan on his reappointment to the Board and stated it is a salutatory move for the University. He then expressed his pleasure in serving under Mr. McCowan's chairmanship, following which Mr. McCowan was given a round of applause.

Mr. McCowan stated it had been a privilege to serve with the Board under the leadership of both President Singletary and President Roselle and that it is indeed an honor to be associated with the group.

V. Acceptance of Interim Financial Report for the University of Kentucky for the Four Months Ended October 31, 1987 (FCR 1)

Mr. Forgy, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the Committee met at 7:30 a.m. on the morning of December 8 and reviewed the agenda items to be presented for action. He then recommended and moved that the Board accept the University of Kentucky consolidated financial report for the four months ended October 31, 1987. The motion was seconded by Professor Betts and carried. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

W. <u>Designation of Depository Bank (FCR 2)</u>

With the concurrence of the Finance Committee, Mr. Forgy recommended that the Board designate First National Bank of Pikeville, Pikeville, Kentucky, to serve as a depository bank for the University of Kentucky and/or its affiliated corporations. The motion was seconded by Judge Tackett and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

X. Authorized Retirement Plan Vehicles (FCR 3)

On motion made by Mr. Forgy, seconded by Professor Betts and carried, the Board adopted the recommendations for incorporation in the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan as specified in FCR 3. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

Y. Report of Lease (FCR 4)

Mr. Forgy moved that the routine report of lease in FCR 4 be adopted and made a matter of record. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hershey and passed. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

Z. Capital Construction Report (FCR 5)

On motion made by Mr. Forgy, seconded by Mr. Stricker and passed, the Board approved the Capital Construction Report for the three months ending September 30, 1987. (See FCR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

AA. Estate of Mrs. Sarah Ruth Geurin (FCR 6)

With the concurrence of the Finance Committee, Mr. Forgy recommended and so moved that the Board approve quasi-endowment of funds received as a bequest from the estate of Mrs. Sarah Puth Geurin. The motion was seconded by Judge Tackett and carried without dissent. (See FCR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

BB. Lease Agreement with Shepherd's House, Inc. (FCR 7)

On motion made by Mr. Forgy, seconded by Professor Betts and carried, authorization was given to the Vice Chancellor for Administration, Lexington Campus, to execute a lease with Shepherd's House, Inc. for rental of 154 Bonnie Brae. (See FCR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

CC. <u>Authorization of Sewer Easement to Cottage Grove</u> <u>Mini-Sewer Project Association and Lexington-Fayette Urban County</u> <u>Government (FCR 8)</u>

Acting on the recommendation of the Finance Committee, Mr. Forgy moved that the Board approve the authorization of the sewer easement to Cottage Grove Mini-Sewer Project Association and Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government as recommended in FCR 8. Mr. Forgy's motion was seconded by Professor Coleman and passed unanimously. (See FCR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

DD. Authorization of Deed to Simon Development Company, Inc. (South Farm - Man O'War Boulevard) (FCR 9)

The Finance Committee so recommending, Mr. Forgy moved that the Board authorize the President of the University to execute and deliver to Simon Development Company, Inc., Indianapolis, Indiana, a Deed of Conveyance transferring title to Tract A of the South Farm for the total purchase price of \$5,850,000. The motion, which was seconded by Mr. Wilcoxson, carried. (See FCR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

EE. Authorization of Deed to Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (South Farm - Man O'War Boulevard) (FCR 10)

Mr. Forgy recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor for Administration, Lexington Campus, to execute a Deed of Conveyance to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government conveying a portion of the University's South Farm for the right-of-way for Man O'War Boulevard. The motion was seconded by Mr. Farmer and carried unanimously. (See FCR 10 at the end of the Minutes.)

FF. Renewal of Lease with Spindletop Hall, Incorporated (FCR

On motion made by Mr. Forgy, seconded by Professor Betts and passed unanimously, the Board approved the renewal of lease with Spindletop Hall, Incorporated as recommended in FCR 11. (See FCR 11 at the end of the Minutes.)

GG. Ownership of Coldstream Farm (FCR 12) and Employment of Consultant for Coldstream Farm (FCR 13

Mr. Forgy indicated that FCR 12 and FCR 13 in their conceptual form need to be considered together. Following an overview, he moved (1) that the Board declare that no portion of Coldstream Farm shall be offered for sale now or in the foreseeable future, but shall be

retained in perpetuity by the University and (2) that the Board direct the Vice Chancellor for Administration of the Lexington Campus to proceed to contract on behalf of the University with the firm of MPC, Inc., of Washington, D.C. to study the potential development of Coldstream Farm so as to maximize its economic return to the University and contribute to the economic development of the Commonwealth in an optimal way while serving the mission of the University. He also indicated that it shall further be the responsibility of MPC to advise the Administration and Trustees on appropriate alternatives for meeting the needs and enhancing the programs of the College of Agriculture currently conducted on the farm. The motion to approve FCR 12, which was seconded by Mr. Wilcoxson, carried without dissent. Mr. Forgy's motion to approve FCR 13 was seconded by Professor Coleman and also carried without dissent. (See FCR 12 and FCR 13 at the end of the Minutes.)

HH. Authorization of Deed to Hutchens Development Company, Inc. (South Farm - Man O'War Boulevard) (FCR 14)

Following a brief overview, Mr. Forgy recommended that the Board authorize the President to execute and deliver to Hutchens Company, Inc., Aiken, South Carolina, a Deed of Conveyance transferring title to Tract B of the South Farm for the total purchase price of \$5,663,775. His motion was seconded by Dr. Pisacano, and it was so ordered. (See FCR 14 at the end of the Minutes.)

II. Report of Investments (ICP 1)

Acting on the recommendation of the Investment Committee, Mr. Hershey moved that the report of changes made in investments for the University of Kentucky and its Affiliated Corporations for the three months ended September 30, 1987, be accepted. His motion was seconded by Dr. Pisacano and passed. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

JJ. Mr. Stricker's Remarks

Mr. Stricker stated that on behalf of Brereton Jones he thanked all of the Trustees who donated their UK basketball tickets to the Kentucky Health Care Access Foundation's very successful fund raising event.

KK. Professor Betts' Remarks

Professor Betts called attention to the retirement of Professor Michael Adelstein, who has served on the Board of Trustees, and stated that Professor Adelstein has given to the University his generous spirit and selfless loyalty the entire 29 years of his tenure.

LL. President Roselle's Announcements

President Roselle announced that invitations for Saturday had been sent to members of the Board to attend a pre-game celebration with their counterparts from the University of Louisville and a reception with members of the Development Council immediately following the game. He expressed his hoped in seeing all of them on Saturday.

MM. Mr. Lassetter's Remarks

Mr. Lassetter stated that he had come to the Board with a desire to serve. The Board has afforded him that opportunity, and he wished the Board Godspeed as it leads the University to even greater heights.

Mr. McCowan expressed his appreciation for the many contributions of Mr. Lassetter, especially his vital role on the Presidential Search Committee, and stated that it has been a real privilege to have him on the Board.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 10:03 a.m.

3. Comments - The increase in regular registration fees will support enrollment growth in the fall and spring programs of the Community College System. The increase in summer session registration fees will support enrollment growth in the summer session program of Owensboro Community College. The increase in University Extension registration fees will support enrollment growth in off-campus and independent study programs of Lexington Campus and the off-campus programs of Ashland, Elizabethtown, Jefferson, Madisonville, Owensboro, Prestonsburg, Somerset, and Southeast Community Colleges. The increase in continuing education registration fees will support new and the expansion of existing community education programs for Agriculture, Elizabethtown, Hopkinsville, Jefferson, Madisonville, Paducah, Prestonsburg, and Southeast Community Colleges. The increase in miscellaneous fees resulting from student services offerings will provide additional funding for the Counseling and Testing Center and Campus Recreation. County Appropriations for fiscal year 1987-88 will support the county extension program. The increase in Federal-Agriculture gifts and grants will support rural, recreation, and tourism development projects through the Agricultural Cooperative Extension Service. The increase in Federal-Vocational Education gifts and grants will support additional special projects to be provided by the College of Education. The increase in other gifts and grants is a result of a grant from the State to support the Kentucky Bluegrass Writing Institute, funding from Fayette County and private sources to support the Fayette Financial Counseling Service provided through the College of Home Economics Family Studies Department, and private gifts and grants to support the Agricultural Cooperative Extension Service Farm Analysis Program and program activities in the Community College System. The increase in farm sales will provide additional support for programs in the Entomology Department. The increase in departmental sales and services will support increased program activities in the College of Fine Arts, Appalachian Center, Counseling and Testing Center, Purchasing, Real Property Division, Student Billing Services, Campus Recreation, Community Dentistry, Orthodontics, Hopkinsville, Jefferson, Madisonville, and Paducah Community Colleges.

Packground: Dr. Thomas D. Clark joined the University of Kentucky in 1931 and later served for 23 years as the head of the Department of History, which he developed into one of the strongest in the South. He published a large number of books, served as President of both the Southern Historical Association and the Organization of American Historians, and served for two years on the Poard of Trustees of the University. He also made major contributions to the Margaret I. King Library and to the State Library and Archives. Pr. Clark retired in 1968 after 37 years of service.

Dr. Clark has demonstrated a deep commitment and has worked vigorously and persistently to raise the level of academic excellence in the University and to improve the quality of education throughout the Commonwealth. It is, however, Dr. Clark's vital contributions to the University of Kentucky Press that make it particularly fitting that this building be named in his honor. He was instrumental in the founding of the University of Kentucky Press in 1943, and he served as chairman of its board for a number of years. Of equal importance is his role in the development of the University Press of Kentucky. He helped to organize the cooperative arrangement among the state's universities and colleges that has led to the highly successful University Press of Kentucky. He now chairs the endowment committee of the Press.

In accordance with University Policy, the Committee for Naming University Buildings has made its recommendation to the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus who recommends to the President and the Board of Trustees that the the building at 663 South Limestone Street be named the THOMAS D. NAMING OF UNIVERSITY BUILDING

Fackground: Mr. Pruce Foundstone was appointed Assistant in Farm Management in the Department of Farm Foundation at the University of Kentucky in 1929 while completing a Master of Science degree which he received in 1931. He later served as head of the Department of Feed and Fertilizer and became Director of Regulatory Services in 1967. He retired in 1971 after almost 42 years of continuous service.

During the 25 years Mr. Foundstone served as administrator of the Regulatory Services program, he built the department into one of the most respected in the nation. He, more than any other single person, developed agricultural regulatory work into a science and a profession. In 1967 he was elected President of the Association of Official Analytical Chemists, only one of two University of Kentucky staff members to be so honored. Today, Kentucky farmers have one of the nation's finest agricultural regulatory programs. The University is beginning construction of a new 3.5 million dollar state-of-the-art laboratory building to house Regulatory Services. This building will either directly, or indirectly, benefit all citizens of the Commonwealth. It is, therefore, fitting that we honor Mr. Foundstone by naming the new Regulatory Services Fuilding, the FRUCE POWDSTONE RECULATORY SERVICES FUILDING.

In accordance with University Policy, the Committee for Naming University Publishings has made its recommendation to the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus who recommends to the President and the Postd of Trustees that the Regulatory Services Publishing be named the BRUCE POUNDSTONE REGULATORY SERVICES BUILDING.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY DEGREE PROGRAM IN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

Recommendation: that the Board approve for submission to the Council on Higher Education a new Doctor of Philosophy degree program in Public Administration.

Background: The University of Kentucky is the principal graduate degree granting university in the statewide system, and as such emphasizes the development of graduate, research, and service programs. It is also the stated aim of the University to maintain adequate support for its Centers of Excellence. The James W. Martin School of Public Administration has been designated by the University as a Center of Excellence in a collaborative effort with the Council of State Governments. This institutional arrangement provides a strong base for significant regional and national research and service activities. The capacity to engage in such efforts will be significantly improved by the addition of faculty and doctoral students interested in public policy issues. The proposed Ph.D. program in Public Administration is consistent with these specific aims of the University and with its broader commitment to promote doctoral education and to enhance its research capability. The Ph.D. program in Public Administration will be consistent with the University's doctoral training, research, and service missions.

The need for doctoral level public administration education emerges principally from changes occurring in government at federal, state, and local levels, and associated private, not-for-profit institutions. Increased demands for more public services in a period of constrained resources will require more sophisticated management of public organizations by well-trained public administrators. At the present time there are no Ph.D. programs in public administration in Kentucky, West Virginia, or Tennessee. With the recent advent of accreditation of master's degree programs, there will be an increasing demand for trained faculty in public administration. Moreover, state governments are attempting to improve the quality of their senior executives and policy analysts. Thus, both academic and governmental institutions will be seeking individuals trained in Public Administration at the Ph.D. level.

The proposed Fh.D. program in Public Administration will prepare students for a variety of academic and professional positions in a national market.

The institution of a bachelor's degree program in Arts Administration is a logical outgrowth of the University's current instructional commitments and its success in meeting these commitments. No Kentucky university offers a program in arts administration at this time. With the increase in the number of performing and visual arts facilities in the region and the nation, and the number of local, regional, and state arts councils, there is a growing need for individuals with both artistic sensibilities and business acumen to work in these areas.

The College of Fine Arts is uniquely qualified to offer a program in arts administration. The College has strong programs in music, visual arts, and theatre that will complement the program in arts administration. Each of these areas is actively engaged in making and presenting art to the University and local and regional communities, in such facilities as the Singletary Center for the Arts, the Guignol Theatre, the Wallace N. Briggs Theatre, and the Center for Contemporary Art. These facilities, as well as others in the surrounding area, offer ideal opportunities for students to gain first-hand experience in the operation of arts facilities.

The proposed program is designed for those individuals who wish to pursue a career in the field immediately following the bachelor's degree, particularly those who have a pronounced interest in or commitment to one or more of the fine arts, but who do not wish to pursue careers based on performance or creative activity, and who do not wish to pursue teaching careers in the arts. The program also prepares students who wish to pursue master of arts, master of fine arts, and master of business administration degree programs in arts administration.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE HEALTH SCIENCES STUDENT PROFESSIONAL BEHAVIOR CODE

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the following amendments to the Health Sciences Student Professional Behavior Code (AR II-7.0-6)

(Note: Proposed deletions are bracketed; proposed additions are underlined.)

Amendment #1 - Change Section B.6 to read:

B.6. Behavior or action [intended to deceive, defraud, or harm] which deceives, defrauds, or harms the public and/or profession;

Amendment #2 - Add the following as Section B.13:

B.13. Commission of any act which has the effect of bringing the student, the University, or the student's intended profession into disrepute, including, but not limited to, any departure from or failure to conform to the standards of acceptable and prevailing professional practice with the state and any departure from or failure to conform to the principles or code of ethics recognized by the licensing, certifying, or professional association or agency of the student's intended profession.

Background for Amendments: The Health Sciences Student Professional Behavior Code was initially approved by the Board of Trustees on June 19, 1984, and subsequently was included in the University of Kentucky Administrative Regulations as AR II-7.0-6. The amendments under consideration, which are recommended to alleviate concerns in implementing the present standards, are the first to be proposed since the approval of the Code in 1984.

During the 1987 spring semester, the Medical Center Student Affairs Committee, which is composed of a representative from the Student Services Office of each college in the Medical Center and two faculty members, reviewed the present standards of the Health Sciences Student Professional Behavior Code and made recommendations for revisions. The Medical Center Cabinet has reviewed and discussed the proposed revisions and supports the amendments recommended. Ms. Gay Elste, Associate Counsel, worked with the Committee on the wording of the amendments and also has reviewed the proposed

amendments following review and support of the Medical Center Cabinet. The Health Sciences Student Professional Behavior Code is applicable at any site which is relevant to professional practice when such conduct occurs at any site which is the subject of a clinical affiliation agreement, or at any site where the student is engaged in a course or other learning experience for credit toward graduation, or upon University property. According to Section J of the Health Sciences Student Professional Behavior Code, all amendments to the Code shall be recommended by the Chancellor for the Medical Center, after consultation with Medical Center deans and other administrators, to the President with final approval of such amendments to be made by the Board of Trustees.

Designation of Depository Bank

The University of Kentucky Division of Purchasing Services invited bids for depository banking services from three banks located in Pikeville, however, no responses were received. The First National Bank of Pikeville was selected by administrative officials at Prestonsburg Community College.

AUTHORIZED RETIREMENT PLAN VEHICLES

<u>Recommendation</u>: That the Board of Trustees approve the following recommendations for incorporation in the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan:

- 1. Authorize Fidelity Investments and Twentieth Century to be utilized as retirement plan vehicles in addition to TIAA/CREF.
- 2. Authorize all new retirement contributions from the employer and employee, if the employee so desires, to be available for investment in any of the authorized vehicles.
- Authorize accumulated funds in Fidelity Investments and Twentieth Century to be distributed at retirement in accordance with the employee's directions utilizing whatever options these companies offer, including rollovers.
- Retain unaltered the policy that retirement distributions of funds invested in TIAA/CREF will continue to be governed by the rules of that company.
- 5. Eliminate Value Line as an authorized company for voluntary tex-sheltered contributions.

<u>Background</u>: Following Board of Trustees approval on June 23, 1987, of the Ad Hoc Retirement Review Committee recommendations, the President appointed a committee to develop the appropriate specifications for alternative retirement vehicles.

The principles approved by the Board of Trustees at its June 23, 1987 meeting stipulated that accumulated funds in non-TIAA/CREF vehicles available for lump-sum distribution at retirement be limited to 50%. At the same time, the Board also directed that accumulated funds in these non-TIAA/CREF vehicles did not have to be annuitized. In reviewing the University's proposed lump-sum withdrawal limit, however, the various companies indicated that this would only be possible to control if the University maintained detailed records and accounts on all employees. Certainly this is not a feasible or practical option and would entail considerable additional expense.

The committee was advised by TIAA/CREF representatives that non-annuitized retirement options, including the use of a number of additional investment

vehicles, was under serious consideration by TIAA/CREF and would no doubt be made available to the various institutions in future years. Making non-annuitized retirement options available, including lump-sum withdrawals, is considered essential for appropriate retirement planning.

Approval of these recommendations will mean that the University has authorized three different companies (TIAA/CREF, Fidelity Investments, and Twentieth Century) to be utilized for retirement plan contributions as well as for voluntary contributions.

The committee noted that only eight employees currently utilize Value Line as a voluntary investment vehicle. With so little interest in Value Line, and considering administrative costs, this voluntary vehicle should no longer be offered. Value Line did not respond to the committee's request for proposals for additional retirement plan vehicles.

The implementation of this alternative retirement program will require approval by the Board of Trustees when the appropriate staff work on the proposed revision of the University of Kentucky Retirement Plan (AR II-1.6-1) has been completed.

Employment of Consultant for Coldstream Farm

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees directs the Vice Chancellor for Administration of the Lexington Campus to proceed to contract on behalf of the University with the firm of MPC, Inc., of Washington, D.C. to study the potential use of Coldstream Farm so as to maximize its economic return to the University, and contribute to the economic development of the Commonwealth in an optimal way while serving the mission of the University. Background: The Finance Committee of the Board of Trustees established a subcommittee of its members on June 23, 1987, for the purpose of selecting a real estate development consulting firm to assist the trustees and the University Administration as they considered the alternatives involved in the future use of Coldstream Farm. The University prepared a "Request for Proposal" that was sent to many firms that had experience and expertise in real estate development. The RFP also was advertised in national and local newspapers. Eleven firms responded to the RFP. Four finalists emerged from the list of Each of the finalists was interviewed at length in respondents. Lexington on Saturday, October 31, 1987, by the members of the subcommittee. The MPC Company was invited back for a second interview on Wednesday, November 18, 1987, and this company was the unanimous choice of the subcommittee as the University's advisor on matters pertaining to the future of Coldstream. As a part of its contract, MPC will meet with various members of the faculty, students, staff, and trustees of the University to ascertain their feelings and ideas on the future use of Coldstream Farm in furtherance of the University's mission. Similarly, MPC will meet with business and agricultural leaders and appropriate government officials to ascertain the various opinions on the future use of the farm. MPC also will collect relevant demographic and market data with respect to the development of Coldstream that do not involve the sale of the property. MPC will report periodically to the Board of Trustees and the Administration on its findings.
