ORGANIZATION. The organization of the Experiment Station as outlined in the last report has been further strengthened by the addition of a department of diseases of live stock, which was created by the Board of Control on June 25, 1915, with Dr. Robert Graham as its head. This department now has the services of six graduate veterinarians and a number of assistants. The department of diseases of live stock actively co-operates with the State Live Stock Sanitary Board in the promulgation and enforcement of all measures looking to the control and eradication of contagious diseases of live stock, and contributes to the support of the office of the State Veterinarian.

As contemplated by the Smith-Lever Act, the work of agricultural extension within the State has been reorganized as the division of agricultural extension in the College of Agriculture, which has gradually assumed the activities and publications of the department of extension in the Experiment Station. Under this organization, the division of extension is co-ordinate with the Experiment Station as a part of the College of Agriculture and, therefore, no statement of this work is included in this report, altho the members of the several departments of the Experiment Station have actively co-operated in the work of the extension division.

INVESTIGATIONS UNDER THE ADAMS AND OTHER FUNDS. The program of work under the Adams Fund during 1915 has been the same as that for the previous year, namely:
