

Mr. Standing 30 Sept. 1834

Dear Sir

The indisposition of a part of my family, has occasioned the delay, of several days of the enclosed exhibition of all the services rendered by Stamboul &c. — I do not know how you will like my method, in presenting this Statement, but I preferred just copying the Book, as it stands, and be at the trouble of making all deductions, for failures, withdrawals & deaths, so that any person who may succeed me, should not an event take place, can by looking at the books see the matter as it then stands corresponding with the "list" I here present. — The other tables of calculations, of course do not appear upon the Books; but are made for easy reference; the whole condensed at one view.

On the subject of the two withdrawals, I have this to say: — one of them, <sup>Mr. Reynolds</sup> the mare was sent, but designed for another horse along with one designed for Stamboul, and they were both entered upon our books at the same time, but the mare was removed without being served. — The other Mr. Dayles mare, was served one leap by Stamboul at Lexington the Saturday before we withdrew him from his Stand, and she not proving in foal Mr. Dayles sent her to Rockland, and immediately advised me of the fact, alleging as a further reason why he done so, that he understood Stamboul could not do any service, and as you were still to be benefited I thought it best to let it go so. — You will see your stand charged with one season on this list — I would like to see it increased as large as mine — and so of Mr. Kimmingham — Mr. K. has not permitted himself to be honored with one Stamboul.

Please let me hear from you on the subject of this. — Any remarks you have to make, I would gladly receive them. My desire is to render every satisfaction.
