My Dear Brother Louisville 17th July 1846

his carriage to my lodgings, and
had ^{me} arrive to see all the good
and pretty things about Columbus
and paid me my fee of \$3.50,
without a murmur, and with

great apparent satisfaction
I was strongly tempted to settle
at Newark in Ohio, but must
in the interest of the cause
be able to leave —
