My Very Dear Brother

I reached Sutter's fort
 in company with E. Bryant, young
 Jacobs of Louisiana, and six others
 on pack mules on the last day
 of August in safety & health, and
 went at once into busness practicing
 law with far more success than I
 could have to have hoped - I was
 elected by a town meeting at Buena
 Ventura the name for a new stock
 = town on the occasion of his first
 visit to that town, and acquitted
 myself quite as well as I could as
 under the most favorable circumstances

Thus I was getting along
 far better than I expected, notwithstanding
 the rumors concerning the war
 and John Fremont being in the country
 as military commander of our forces.
 I felt myself constrained to join him
 and here I am in the Santa Barbara
 and it is supposed on the top of
