The Cats should enjoy the win as long as possible, considering they will travel to Gainesville to face the top-ranked team in the country in Florida. The Gators beat Tennessee 35-29 last week in Knoxville.



# Minor league baseball plans supported by UK

UK sports officials support attempts to bring minor league baseball to Lexington despite possible disadvantages for the University's baseball program. Lexington is competing against eight other cities for one of two Class AA expansion franchises. Play would begin in 1999.

UK Athletics Director C.M. Newton said he has no problem with a minor league team coming to Lexington. "If it's good for the community, then we're all for it," Newton said. Newton, who used to play minor league baseball, said he does not think a minor league baseball, said he does not think a minor league baseball, since their seasons do not run concurrently.

The college season runs from February to May; minor league teams puly from April to September.

The only disadvantage Newton saw for UK was that the professional team might siphon entertainment dollars away from UK baseball.

Still, Newton said this should not be a significant problem for the University.

# NATION Old basketball arena burns at Auburn

AUBURN, Ala. — Auburn's old wooden basketball arena, fondly known as "The Barn," went out with a bang, shooting flames high into the air and providing a dramatic backforp for the nationally televised LSU-Auburn football game.

Auburn Fire Chief Ronny Blankenship said yesterday that investigators believe a barbecue grill from a tailgate party may have been responsible.

The fire began to appear over the northeast orner of Jordan-Hare Stadium early in the first quarter of LSU's 19-15 win over Auburn on Saturday night. But none of the \$5,214 people were ever in danger and no thought was ever given to evacuating the stadium, which was 50 yards away and across the street from the fire.

Nobody was injured and only two cars suffered slight damage as firefighters hosed down vehicles in the building's parking lot, which had been open for tailgating before the game.



The top-ranked Cornhuskers had their The top-ranked Cornhuskers had their 26-game winning streak snapped Sarurday night in a stunning 19-0 lost to No. 17 Arizona State on the same field where they won their second straight national championship in January.

The Sun Devils, routed by the Huskers 77-28 last season, recorded three safeties in handing the Huskers 19-10 decision to lowa 22-0 loss to Miami in the 1992 Orange Bowl, and its first regular-season loss since dropping a 19-10 decision to lowa State on Nov. 14, 1992.

It also was just the second regular-season shutout during coach Tom Osborne's 24-year tenure at Nebraska. Oklahoma beat the Huskers 19-0 in 1973, Osborne's first year as head coach in Lincoln.



And while the group's second album, Another Level, might provide a few, it's not the trend setting stuff Riley was cranking out in the late "80s.

Actually, it is a similar sound. The problem is, it's 1996.

Riley is — to be politically correct — vocally challenged. Smartly, he let the Hall brothers, Aaron and Damion, handle most of the lead vocals in his Guy days. Here, the sometimes takes too much of the spotlight without letting talented Chauncy, "Black" Hannibal strut his stuff often enough.

That's especially apparent on "My Paradise," a jazzy little tune that could use some of Hannibal's soulful stuff over the groove. Unfortunately, Riley insists on leading off the track with his own strained vocals, preventing it from being the album's high point.

Riley still concocts bootiemovers with the best of them, though. The thumping first single, "No Diggity," featuring Dr. Te, will make you groove. Sally, short of a couple of nice mid-tenpo grooves like "Happy Song (Tonite)," there aren't more tunes like it.




