The Faculty met in called session at 12 M. in the Presidents room. There were present: Pres^r Patterson, Prof^r Shankford, White, Kirby, W^c Parland, W. K. Patterson, Pnce, Peter, Cranall and Hevly. Object of meeting to hear charges brought by Board of Discipline against

1. Cadet Slay. Charge: Absent without leave, breaking arrest, firing ball cartridge in College Grounds.
2. Cadets Burbridge, Emery and Logan. Charge: Firing Ball Cartridge in College Grounds, March 6th.
 Moved and seconded (Prof Shankford) that they be dismissed. ^{seconded} Amended (Dr Peter) that they be suspended to the end of the term + 2nd Amend^t. (Prof White) that they be put under arrest for 2 months. Sec. 2nd Amend^t moved lost. Gives amendment carried, original motion lost.
3. Cadet Logan: charge: Failing to take up his proper number of studies and general neglect of study. Moved and seconded that his father be requested to withdraw him. Carried.
4. Cadet Bugale. Charge: (Drunk, firing pistols etc.) Moved and seconded that he be publicly dismissed. Carried. There being no further business the Faculty adjourned.

The Faculty met in called session at 12 M. in the Presidents room. There were present, President Patterson, Prof^r Kirby, White, Hevly, Shankford, Peter, Cranall, W. K. Patterson, Pnce, W^c Parland and Hevly. Object of the meeting, as stated by the President, to determine when examinations are to begin, in what order they are to follow each other, and what committees are to be appointed, to attend the different examinations. Moved and seconded Hevly that the senior classes are to be examined first, and that

the President arrange for the examination of the
 others and appoint Committees to attend. Carried.

On Motion of Prof. Neville it was determined
 that in making up the standing of any student
 the result of examination shall count for one
 half, that is, as much as the standing obtained
 by the student by the whole year's work.

The committee on "Governor's Medal" then
 reported as follows:

The Committee, appointed to report conditions
 on which the Medal offered by the Governor, shall be
 awarded, recommend, that the Medal be given
 to that student whose average standing shall
 be greater than that of his fellow students on
 at least four daily recitations and the exam-
 inations thereon provided said average is not
 less than 90% of perfect and that the general
 conduct of said student is good. The person
 who receives the medal must have been a
 matriculate of this College not less than $\frac{3}{4}$
 of the session at the close of which the medal
 is given." On Motion the report was adopted.

The Faculty then adjourned.
