

MEALS

A choice of meal contracts is available to graduate students who wish to eat in University residence hall cafeterias. Graduate students desiring a meal plan must indicate, on the application, whether a two- or three-meal plan is desired.

Assignments

Room assignments are made according to the date the completed housing application, first installment, and housing contract are received in the Housing Office. Filing an application does not guarantee an assignment, nor does it in any way coincide with or affect admission to the University of Kentucky. Receipt of the residence hall assignment will be confirmation of housing for the student.

Students may select their own roommate by indicating their choice on the application. To obtain this assignment, two actions are necessary. First, each student must select the other as the roommate preferred, and second, both applications must arrive in the Housing Office during the same week (preferably in the same envelope). Within the limits of academic classification, residence halls may be selected, provided space is available. The limitation is that only freshmen can be assigned to residence halls designated for freshmen.

An effort is made to select a suitable roommate, according to similar interests and backgrounds, for those students not designating a roommate choice. Further, assignments to rooms are made within 30 days after admission to the University or by May 1, whichever is later. Notice of an assignment will contain the name of the residence hall, the room number and telephone number.

Late applicants may be temporarily assigned three to a room. These students will be reassigned as soon as determination can be made concerning those students who have been assigned and who do not come to the University. There are additional students who withdraw from the University shortly after arriving on campus, thus freeing space.

If some extra students were not assigned at the beginning of the semester, it would be necessary to have higher rates to account for vacancies, while later applicants would be forced off-campus.

Furnishings and Linen Service

The residence halls supply each student with a mattress pad. Pillows, sheets, pillow cases, blankets, spreads and towels are not furnished. Information concerning linen service is mailed to the student after he receives his housing assignment. Subscription to

this service is voluntary, and is an agreement between the student and the linen company.

Laundry facilities in the residence halls are not adequate for bed linens and are limited to personal items. Desk blotters are not supplied, but must be used in order to protect the top surface of the furniture. Rooms should be kept locked. The residence staff is not responsible for personal property.

Pest-proof metal containers are required when food is kept in the rooms. Cooking appliances are not allowed in student rooms. Wastebaskets are to be provided by the student. Soap dishes, water glasses, ash trays, an electric iron and a laundry rack will probably be found useful. Ironing boards are furnished and automatic pay washing machines and dryers are located in all residence units. The rooms in Keeneland Hall have adjoining baths, and Keeneland residents are expected to provide cleaning supplies for their bath facilities.

It is suggested that students delay any decision concerning room accessories until arrival on campus. The room assignment will be mailed to the student between May and August, depending upon the date the completed application is received by the Housing Office.

Mail and Luggage

Student mail should be addressed to the residence hall and post office box number.

Luggage should be addressed to the specific room and residence to which the student has been assigned. Trunks may not be kept in bedrooms, but may be placed in the luggage storage room in each hall.

Student Motor Vehicles

All students registered as freshmen or sophomores at the University, regardless of the number of years they have attended college, and all students on academic or disciplinary probation, are forbidden to possess and/or operate motor vehicles at the University unless they are married, commuting, or have special permission from Safety and Security. All students are discouraged from bringing cars unless necessary. Parking space cannot be assured and students may not drive cars on the main campus during school hours, unless they have a parking permit for the campus area.

Damages

Occupants of the rooms are personally responsible for the care of furnishings. Assessments will be made for damage to the residence hall or its furnishings.
