- ↓ Physics 12, Teaching of High School Physics, 3 credits
- ↓ Physics 13, Elements of Radio Communication, 3 credits
- ↓ Physics 107, Theoretical Mechanics, 3 credits
- ↓ Physics 108, Theory of Light, 3 credits
- ↓ Physics 14a, General College Physics, 3 credits
- ↓ Physics 14b, General College Physics, 3 credits.

2. Concerning Credits in Physical Education:

All students who participate in Freshman or Varsity sports for the entire season of that sport, will receive credit in Physical Education for that semester. All who do not report regularly will be required to take up regular classes in Physical Education.

MINUTES OF THE SENATE JANUARY 8, 1923

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, January 8, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of December 11 were read and approved.

Upon recommendation of the Council, Senate approved the organization of Omega Rho, Women's social fraternity.

Senate approved the following recommendation from the College of Agriculture:

- ↓ Home Economics 108 - changed to ^{Nutrition} H. E. 131 - title remains the same.
- ↓ Animal Industry 6a-6b - reduced from four to three credits and no. changed to Animal Industry 17a-17b.

It was voted that this be retroactive, so as to include the past year. The courses were given without authority.

The following recommendation was approved:
