That the extreme athleticism which has been indulged in lately by many of our universities has caused a general increase in "cribbing" does not seem to be a logical answer to this question. It is to be hoped that the situation at Chapel Hill is not taken up by the energy lamble as a damaging conclusion against general public as a damaging conclusion against all our educational institutions.
