

Minutes of the Executive Committee - Sept. 15, 1914

The Executive Committee met this day, Messrs. Nicholls Terrell and Stoll being present. Mr. Nicholls in the chair. In the absence of Judge Lafferty Mr. Stoll was elected Secretary of the Meeting.

It was stated by the committee that Prof. Mackenzie desired the committee to reconsider the action of the Board of Trustees relative to the headship of the Department of English. The committee determined that inasmuch as the Board had acted on the matter after a full hearing, this committee could not reopen the matter.

The matter of the Budget was next considered.

Mr. Terrell stated that he did not believe the Department of Rural Engineering had sufficient clerical force to keep the department in touch with the road engineers of the State.

It was agreed that the President should look into this matter, and if the clerical force was not sufficient, that he could add such additional clerical force as, in his opinion might be deemed necessary.

President Barker stated that in his opinion Prof. Anderson should be paid a salary of \$4000 a year, and he recommended that the committee so fix his salary.

Thereupon, it was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that part of the Budget of the Mechanical Engineering Department set aside for supplies be taken from the Budget and added to the salary of Prof. Anderson, Dean of that department, making his salary \$4000 a year, and that Prof. Anderson be required to do all architectural work and all other services for the college proper, exclusive of the Agricultural Experiment Station, without any compensation therefor.

Upon motion made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Budget as amended, presented by the Business Agent, was adopted and copy ordered filed with the minutes.

Mr. Stoll suggested that at a former meeting of the Executive Committee, Judge Lafferty, Secretary of the Board, stated that the Cafeteria, or University Commons, would be operated without any expense to the College; that is to say, that the College would erect a building to cost \$2500 and that there would be no further expense to the College of any kind in operating this Cafeteria.

Mr. Stoll suggested that this statement should have been recorded in the minutes of the last meeting. As it was not done, Judge Lafferty, being present at this meeting, made the statement again, to the effect that it is the plan to conduct the Cafeteria so that a sum in savings can be made so as to meet the expenses of equipment to make it self sustaining.

It being twelve o'clock, the Executive Committee, proceeded to open the ballots cast for the nomination of members of the Board of Trustees as provided by law and by the regulations of the Board of Trustees. These ballots were opened publicly in the room set apart for the use of the Board of Trustees. Besides the Executive Committee there were present at the opening of the ballots: Joseph Kastle, J. D. Turner, Ollie Sheed, Am M. Peter, J. Pelham Johnston, George B. Cary, J. W. Carnahan, H. A. Davies, W. E. Freeman, Prof. W. S. Webb, J. S. McHargue and S. D. Averitt.

The Committee appointed Mr. J. Pelham Johnston and H. A. Davies to act as tellers, and the following persons received the number of votes set beside their names:

The resignation of T. J. Barr, assistant inspector of mines for Kentucky was made known and he was elected as a professor in Mining Engineering in the College of Mines and Metallurgy. The election of Joseph W. Reed as assistant inspector of Mines for Kentucky was made known and his election was ordered certified to the Governor of Kentucky by the secretary of the Board.

It was moved, seconded and carried that no fee will be charged persons connected with the University who may matriculate and do work in the University classes but such person shall take no class work so as to interfere with the work which his employment requires.

It was ordered that Hywel Davies execute the usual bond required by the Business Agent of the University.

At a meeting held by the Executive Committee of State University, in the Trustees' room on the University campus, December 1, 1914, there were present: C. B. Nichols, R.C. Stoll, C. B. Terrell and T. L. Edelen.

The Executive Committee, at the hour of twelve o'clock, proceeded to open the envelopes containing the ballots cast by the members of the Alumni Association for the election of six trustees for this university. The vote was carefully tabulated and counted, resulting as follows:

Philip Preston Johnston, Jr., received four hundred and sixty-five (465) votes; John Edwin Brown, four hundred and sixty-one (461) votes; Joel Ervine Lyle, three hundred and seventy-six (376) votes; George Green Brock, three hundred and sixty-one (361) votes; John Wesley Woods, three hundred and forty-eight (348) votes; Samuel Blackburn Marks, two hundred and ninety-eight (298) votes; Daniel Stilwell Roberts, two hundred and seventy-three (273) votes; Felix Kerriek, two hundred and fifty-five (255) votes; William Henry Grady, two hundred and thirty-five (235) votes; Edward Conrad Wurtele, two hundred and twenty-six (226) votes; Samuel Boia Cloeman, two hundred and twenty-three (223) votes; and Mrs. Charles Judson Smith, one hundred and eighty-nine (189) votes.

Whereupon, the said Executive Committee declared Philip Preston Johnston, John Edwin Brown, Joel Ervine Lyle, George Green Brock, John Wesley Woods, and Samuel Blackburn Marks, duly elected, and named the first two as trustees, to serve six years; the second two, to serve four years; and the last two, to serve two years. And the secretary of the Executive Committee was ordered to certify this result to the Governor of the State, that commissions might be issued to them as such trustees.

The Committee then adjourned.
