you have succeeded in collecting the sixty Doll  
-ars Hutchinson & Bently owe me their note for  
which I left with you together with Judge  
Clarke's note for sixty Dollars as collateral  
security, from them to me.

I am pushed for funds. or I would not  
trouble you with this letter. if you have  
not already; I am in hopes you will soon  
be able to collect the sixty Dollars either  
from Hutchinson & Bently or from Judge  
Clark.
